Champions Human Rights

Collision Course is a documentary film produced by the British Broadcasting Corporation which presents in a dramatic way the role that the Church in that country has taken on human rights issues.

The film features important Roman Catholic Church leaders such as Bishop Francisco Claver, S.J. of the diocese of Bukidnon in Mindanao and Franciscan Sister Marietta and it shows the radical choices they have had to make when faced with the dilemma of remaining silent or having to challenge their government in the defence of human rights. Affirming that the Church is not only a religious community, but also an economic and political force and rather than acquiescing to their poli-

tical situation, the Filipino men and women featured in Collision Course chose to confront their political leaders on such issues as martial law, arbitrary arrest, press censorship and torture. In Collision Course they explain why they feel they were forced to take these positions on human rights and social justice.

In doing so, like Archbishop Oscar Romero, who was assassinated last March in San Salvador, they demonstrate for us again the political and economic implications of the Gospel.

This film presentation is approximately one hour in length and will be shown etc... A welcome is extended to all interested persons.
