Very Latest Telegrams.

London, Aug. 22. Madrid advices asserts that the preliminaries of a treaty for ceding Cuba to the United States have been signed. Admiral Nanes of the Spanish Navy is dead. The Spanish Regent Serrano positively denies that he sustains the pretensions of the Duke of Montpensier to the Throne of Spain, and declares that he is entirely neutral on the question of the disposal of the Crown.

New York, Aug. 23. The Cuban cause is assuming a more favorable aspect. Conspiracies to thwart the Volunteers and aid the Cubans are in existence among the Spanish residents in the Island. De Rodas, the Spanish commander, is about to resign and return to Spain.

New York, Aug. 24. Gold advanced to 132 1/2 under the cable report about the purchase of Cuba. Sterling Exchange 109 1/2. Money easy. Philadelphia is experiencing scarcity of water, owing to the severe drought. Commodore Vanderbilt has married Miss Crawford of Mobile.

Paris, 19. The Patrie of to-day asserts that the parties of Carlists on Spanish soil are increasing, and that in some cases they have met with successes. It is claimed that they have captured nine officers and forty privates of the Spanish army. The article hints that within a month a great military event of which it gives no particulars, will happen in Spain, after which Don Carlos will publish a manifesto.
