

Solemn Feast Observed At Mount Saint Mary's

The Feast of the Assumption was fittingly celebrated at Mount Saint Mary's on Friday evening, August 15th, with Solemn High Mass celebrated at 5:30 p.m. out doors before the Lady of Fatima Shrine. Members of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Marcellina assembled from many of their schools and convents to join in this commemoration of the Centenary of the Apparitions at Lourdes in 1858 and to conclude the novena of prayers for peace which preceded the Feast of the Assumption.

Only once before, in July 1941, when the Sisters of St. Marcellina celebrated the Silver Jubilee of their founding, was Mass celebrated outside at Mount St. Mary's. The setting on Friday was especially beautiful; the grounds with the trees, shrubs, and flowers being at their very best.

The celebrant of the Mass was Rev. Frederick Coghlan, C. S. S. R., the deacon, Rev. William Stimpson; and the sub-deacon, Rev. Charles Cheverie. The special sermon for the occasion was given by Rev. Walter Reid.

Mr. John Walsh, seminarian with the Scarborough Foreign Missions Society, was Master of Ceremonies.

Lobstermen Would Limit Trap Numbers

With a view to improving the fishery in Northumberland Strait, over one hundred lobster fishermen met at Pictou, N. S., on Friday to discuss fishing conditions in 7-B District which includes part of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, and concluded the meeting with the formation of the Northumberland Fishermen's Association.

Prince Edward Island and the counties of Antigonish and Inverness were not represented at the meeting which passed several resolutions, among them being the limiting of each boat owner to 400 traps, raising the minimum size and stiffer penalties for short lobsters. The one resolution defeated called for the reduction of the season by ten days.

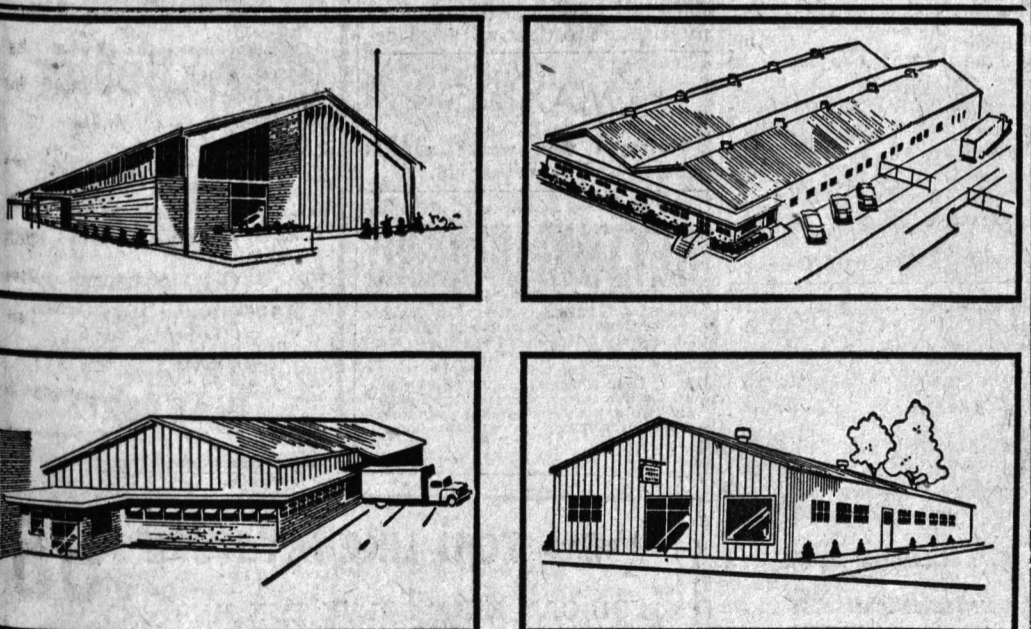

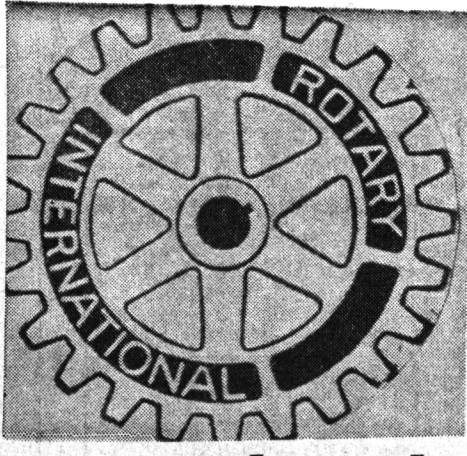

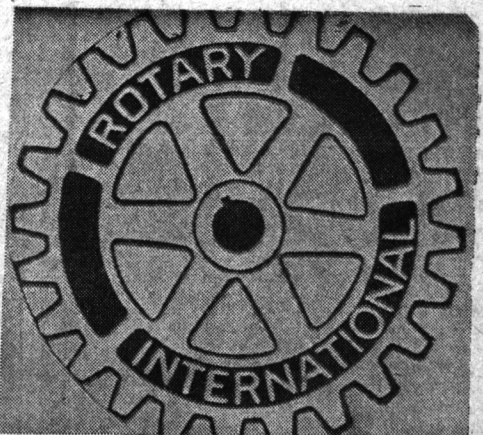
