Charges Violation Of Human Rights

Mr. Roger Baldwin, Chairman of the International League for the Rights of Man, a United Nations Consultant Agency, has taken up the matter of the persecution of the Baha'is in Iran. Miss Ellen Simms, secretary of the Baha'i Assembly of Charlottetown said today. In a letter to Dag Hammarskjold, Secretary General of the United Nations, Mr. Baldwin stated that Iran's ban on three-quarters of a million adherents to the Baha' Faith in that country was a violation of the provisions of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights which was supported by Iran in the United Nations Assembly. He noted that while the Baha' Faith had suffered many attacks since its founding in Iran over 100 years ago, nothing compares with the destruction which broke out last year, and that he was aware of any similar religious persecution elsewhere in the world.
