Men, Machines Race Mud In Alberta Search For Oil

EDMONTON (CP)—The warm breezes of spring mean one thing to the men searching for oil in Alberta's musky country: A race to move drilling rigs and machinery before the thaw makes ground travel impossible.

A nip-and-tuck push of men and machinery is taking place at Judy Creek in the Virginia Hills, 140 miles northwest of Edmonton and about 25 miles north of the major oilfield of Swan Hills.

Imperial Oil Limited is rushing five drilling rigs across the softening muskeg and mud into the area of its Judy Creek discovery well.

The company's wildcat well came in late in February, capping years of exploration of the area.

HOW GOODS

The problem now is to find out how good and how big the field is—as quickly as possible.

"Judy Creek appears to be an extension of the Swan Hills pool," said V. E. Bohme, northern district engineer with the Alberta oil and gas conservation board. Geology comparisons, analysis

Construction Decline Seen

MONTREAL (CP)—A drop in money spent on construction is forecast for 1959 by the Bank of Montreal's business review of March.

The review says last year's decline in capital spending probably will be halted in 1959.

But, quoting official appraisals, the bank said the estimated capital expenditure progress of about \$8,300,000,000 is still slightly less—by about \$100,000,000 or one per cent—than the estimated accomplishments of 1958.

Even so, it adds, the 1959 program is "by all previous standards... a very large program."

The review says the over-all decline is expected to take the form of a cutback in construction outlays.

Electric Company Earnings Decline

TORONTO (CP)—Canadian General Electric Company Ltd. Wednesday reported a nine-per cent decrease in earnings for 1958 over the previous year.

In its annual report, the company showed net earnings of \$10,070,230 or \$53.04 a share for 1958, compared with \$11,079,879 or \$58.37 in 1957.

J. Herbert Smith, president, said the company's sales for 1958 totalled \$232,526,531, an 11 per cent decrease over 1957's total of \$260,028,358.

Hotel Project To Be Resumed

HALIFAX (CP)—Work has been resumed on an 11-storey addition to the Nova Scotia hotel here. Completion of the \$4,000,000 addition will make the hotel the biggest east of Montreal.

The new section will contain 160 rooms, a large ballroom a cafeteria, and several salons. The ballroom will accommodate 1,000 persons at a meeting, and has dining facilities for 600.
