CONTRACT BRIDGE

Best dealer. Both sides vulnerable. NORTH: K J 8, 6 5 3, 7 6 5 2, A K 4. WEST: 5 3 2, 10 8 7 2, K Q 10 9 4, 7. EAST: 10 8 7, K Q J, 8, 5. SOUTH: A Q 9 8, A 9 4, 7 3, J 10 8.

The bidding: East South West North Pass 1NT Pass 3NT

Opening lead—king of diamonds. Declarer was able to work out a most unusual endplay situation in this hand, which was played in a duplicate tournament.

West led the king of diamonds. South ducked, hoping for a diamond continuation, but West switched to the two of hearts.

East played the jack of hearts on the deuce, and South let him win it. But when East continued with the king of hearts, declarer correctly decided it was time to

take the lead. He won the king with the ace.

Declarer had already envisioned the endplay position that would eventually come up, and he needed the nine of hearts as an exit card to be used later at the propitious moment. All indications pointed strongly to the probability that West had started with four hearts and five diamonds (since East had failed to return a diamond).

Declarer ran four spade tricks and cashed the ace of clubs. He noted that West had started with exactly three spades, which fitted South's plan perfectly.

Now declarer led a heart, East winning the nine with the queen. East had only clubs left and had to return a club, giving South a free club finesse and his ninth trick at the same time.

East could have avoided the endplay had he discarded the queen of hearts when declarer cashed his fourth spade. But it would have done him no good. Instead of East being endplayed, West would have found himself endplayed!

Suppose East had discarded the heart queen on the fourth spade. South plays exactly the same way. Again he exits with the nine of hearts.

This time West wins the trick with the ten. West can also cash the eight, but he is then forced to lead a diamond into South's A-J, giving declarer his ninth trick. All roads lead to Rome!

Rocket Plane Is Criticized

LONDON (Reuters) — Opposition members of Parliament Tuesday accused the government of sending "most secret" rocket equipment to Australia in the oldest plane available, by the most mountainous route and as close to the Russian border as possible.

The criticisms followed a crash in the mountains of northeastern Turkey three weeks ago of a British Tudor plane. The 12-man crew was killed.

Prime Minister Macmillan replied that another route now is being used for flights of supplies to the Woomera rocket range in Australia.

Labor MP wanted to know why charter planes "that are 20 years old" were used for the flights rather than RAF machines.

Macmillan said some air force

Citizenship 'Strain' Seen

OTTAWA (CP) — Opposition Leader Pearson said Tuesday that there has never been such a strain on world citizenship as in the last few years.

Mr. Pearson was speaking to 190 students from across Canada, who are here attending a four-day "adventure in citizenship" sponsored by the Rotary Clubs.

He told the students that Canadians must know more about other countries to help maintain world peace.

Monday the students were given certificates of Canadian citizenship by Prime Minister Diefenbaker and were addressed by Finance Minister Fleming.

500 Rebels Hit Gracias

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras (AP)—A band of about 500 rebels swooped down on Gracias, a state capital in Western Honduras, Monday night. The government said Tuesday they were driven out after holding the city for four hours.

Civilians joined garrison troops to beat back the rebels. Gracias is the capital of Elmpira State, near the Guatemalan frontier.

The government reported that four soldiers were killed and an undetermined number of troops and civilians wounded in the fighting.

Loan Cutting Story Denied

OTTAWA (CP)—Finance Minister Fleming Tuesday denied that the Bank of Canada had asked the chartered banks to curtail personal and commercial lending.

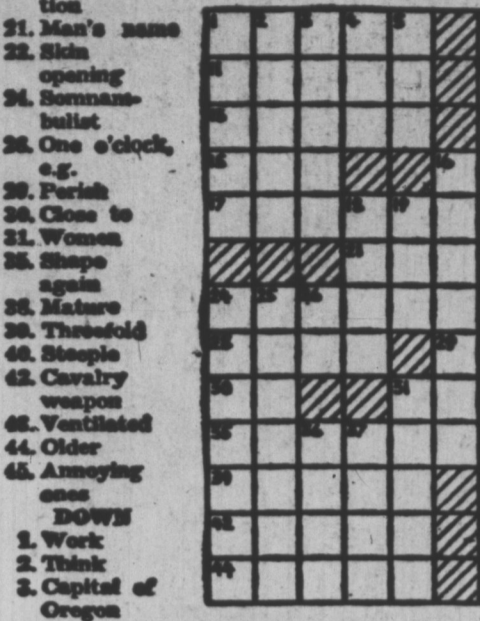
