(Continued from page 1) ... homes were without water for drinking and total damage on the island was expected to hit about \$15,000,000. Early reports from Haiti had listed the death toll at more than 400, but the figure leaped dramatically Monday. Citizens of Port au Prince were in fear of a new hurricane which weathermen there told them could be worse than Flora.

CAPITAL ISOLATED

The capital city was isolated from the provinces by flooded roads and was unable to sustain life for the most stricken areas. Philippe said Haiti had accepted the P.W.C. and he expected disaster survey teams would start work this week. Since leaving Haiti, Flora has been pummeling Cuba. Her death toll and material damage done have done damage mounting toward proportions of economic ruin. The Caribbean satellite of the Soviet Union is in a state of emergency.
