AT THE OPFRA HOUSE

Dreadful Scene.

LONDON, July 1.—The Rome correspondent of the Daily Mail says: The chamber of deputies today (Friday) was transformed into a veritable battlefield. The tumult was terrific. More than 20 deputies were injured in the struggle, including Baron Sonnino, who was seriously hurt. Baron Sonnino is the leader of the majority and the probable future premier. The chamber will now be closed until November.

A secret ballot having been ordered upon certain bills, the socialists rushed down to prevent it. Signor Sonnino advanced first to register his vote, but the socialist deputy, Signor Bissolati, dealt him a violent blow near the temple. Signor Sonnino then seized him by the throat and coat collar and threw him down, receiving himself, in the meantime, numerous blows from the other socialists who took part in the affair. While this tussel was in progress, hand to hand combats were waging all around and the Conservatives, Signor Santini, and Signor Bertolini used their fists upon the socialists with great effect. Signor Costa, socialist, with his sleeves turned up, dealt blows right and left.

NOTES AND COMMENTS.

—Remarking upon the fact that Prince Edward Island papers have complained that a large portion of the amounts charged against the province for public works is spent on printing and advertising in Montreal, Ottawa and Halifax. One wharf, on which \$297 45 was spent in repairs, having cost \$96.13 in printing and advertising to get the job done, the Montreal Gazette says that: "Evidently when the Laurier Government adopts the system of public tender, it does things on a scale no less generous than on any other occasion."

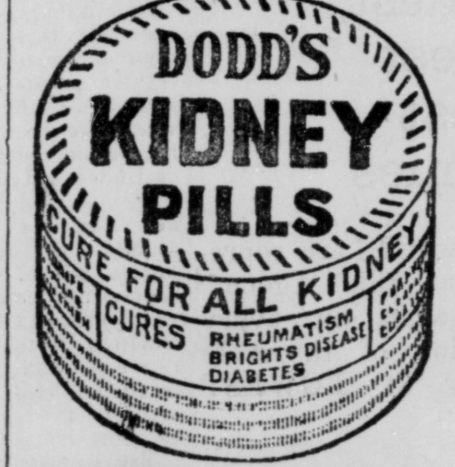

HOW TO GET TO CHARLOTTETOWN

The steamer Halifax leaves Boston for Charlottetown every Saturday at noon and will be due at Charlottetown on Monday night. On the following Tuesday at one she will leave on return to Boston. Halifax and Port Hawkesbury are called at every trip. Passengers may take the steamer at any of the ports mentioned. The Halifax will be supplemented by the Grand Duchess later in the season.

The steamer City of Ghent plys between Halifax and Charlottetown each week, calling at several ports en route. She is due here every Thursday.

The steamers Coban, Bonavista, Campana, Tiber and Polino, of Montreal, also make Charlottetown a port of call.

Passengers for this Province coming by way of Pictou are brought to Charlottetown by the steamer Princess. Those coming by way of Point Du Chene connect with the steamer Northumberland, and may come through to Charlottetown by the mail special which leaves Summerside each evening immediately after the steamer reaches that port.

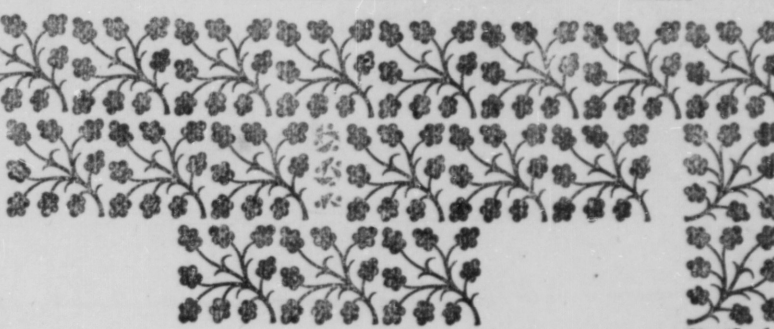
