Claims Progress In Dealing With Problem Of Unemployed Youth

(By The Canadian Press) HALIFAX, July 12.—Building "upon" solid experience, with some regard for prudence and economy," the Liberal Administration has made great strides in dealing with the problem of unemployed youth, Labor Minister Norman McL. Rogers said here tonight.

Liberal speakers could present a record of what has been done, Mr. Rogers said in answer to "the vague promises of Dr. Manion (Conservative Leader R.J. Manion) of a program designed as a sort of parallel to the civilian conservation corps in the United States." This he said, "has been the one practical suggestion by Dr. Manion of what he may do in the future. It seems strange, however, that the C. C. was instituted in the United States in 1932, and yet the Bennett-Manion Administration failed to take any parallel action at that time.

Send me your wool to be spun into yarn and woven into blankets. The charges are: 25 cents for single yarn, doubled 26 cents; per pound. Blankets cost \$2.00 laundered; and if un-laundered \$1.85.

It takes five pounds of wool per blanket. Wool must be well washed, all burrs and dirt picked out. The size of single yarn medium, and doubled yarn, is fine, medium and coarse, also hooking yarn. Put shipper's name, address, owners name and instructions inside all parcels. Send by mail or freight. Freight will be paid on 100 pound lot. Price of well washed, dry, picked, white wool is 25 cents per pound. Price for unwashed wool 12 cents cash, 14 cents trade. Auto robes, blankets and Fancy Bed Throws for sale.
