PREMIER RESUMES DISCUSSION ON REPORT OF EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The debate on the Education Committee report was resumed in the Legislature yesterday afternoon by Premier A. W. Matheson. The Premier spoke on the educational problem for about forty minutes before adjourning the discussion until today or tomorrow.

In his discussion of the matter the Premier lauded the work of Hon. Keir Clark, Minister of Education, expressed the opinion that the failure rate at Prince of Wales College is somewhat comparable to what it had been years ago and compared statistics of entrance results in 1913 with 1952.

In his opening remarks the Premier stated: "This report is one which has caused a great deal of argument in the press and in the House. There has been some confusion regarding the appointment of the committees. Several have argued that there should never have been a committee on education."

"My reasons for having such a committee were that the matter had been argued in the press and in the House for the last two years. Last year the senior member from Charlottetown spoke very heatedly on the matter and was answered in the same tone by the Premier and then Minister of Education."

"That was one thing in the back of my mind and then in the early part of 1954 there were a number of letters in the press. These letters discussed many problems including the failure rate at P.W.C. The Premier was considerably discouraged by one of them and asked permission to answer it."

"The Minister of Education was not available by phone so he asked me if there was any objection towards writing a letter in reply. I said no and he replied to the letter. It was published in at least one newspaper, The Guardian."

"With this and the general discussion I thought it proper to have a committee appointed from this House to look into the situation. The education problem is very, very important and there are enough people interested in it to cause quite a commotion."

Closed But Not Locked
"The committee appointed I think performed a very important service. The Press said the hearings were held behind closed doors. Most committees met behind closed doors in fact but it was not that the doors were locked. I don't think it was ever the intention of anyone to have the meetings behind closed doors."

"In the House we did have a public hearing that was recorded and some of the evidence extended. It is the principle to have a committee of the House look into the affairs of the Government. The Government is here to guide, not to drive."

"The committee to investigate was appointed during the opening of the debate. How the committee was appointed has been fully explained and we will leave it to the record."

Pleasant Recollections

Referring to the "Indictment of Prince of Wales College" he stated "I have very pleasant recollections personally of P.W.C. I suppose I was just as mischievous as anyone else who ever entered the College and worse than some. My memories of P. W. C. are lasting and very, very valuable."

"A person must absorb something from an institution. Those who passed with the highest marks are not always the ones who made the most success in life. There are those who pass and fall and those who fail should not be classed as failures. If the student has honestly tried he has performed a very important function for himself."

"I have an idea that the failure rate of years ago is somewhat comparable to what it is today although I have no figures at hand."

He stated that he would never forget his days around P. W. C. with Dr. Robertson. "I still recall him speaking of my health when I was as tall as I am now and 75 pounds lighter. He took a great interest in his students. He told you what to do and how you should do it."

"Down through the years there have been changes. You will find them in the reports. There were changes under Dr. Steele and Dr. MacKinnon. A good teacher does not necessarily make a good Principal and a good Principal does not necessarily make a good

teacher. If you can get a good one to do both you should do something to hold on to him."

"Now we have a young man at Prince of Wales College. He was born in Prince Edward Island and has come quite a distance. No doubt every member in the House was impressed by him during the hearing."

"The gathering of P.W.C. students here caught my fancy. I was very happy to see them here after hearing a report that there was something close to a revolution at the College."

"Unfortunately a few days after the report was presented to the House a National magazine carried a story on senators and the author was the Principal of the College. A number of the members of the House were offended by the story possibly because they were not named."

"Dr. MacKinnon is a young man and I would say ambitious. You can't fault him for being young and certainly can't fault him for being ambitious."

"I would like to refer to the Minister of Education, Mr. Clark. He has performed a very, very difficult task. I have a high regard for him. In my years in the House I have not heard as fine a report on education as was given by him this year in both his speeches."

"He too is young and ambitious. He has the interest of the Department of Education before him at all times. He has many problems but I do believe if you give him time and not too much time he will be able to work himself out of these problems."
