PERSONAL CHATS.

Senator Thurston says he was ambitious to become a senator ever since the age of 12.

Lieutenant John C. Fremont, son of "the Pathfinder," has been appointed supervisor of New York harbor.

Cesar Thompson, the famous Belgian violinist, has received from King Humbert the honor of knighthood in the order of Sts. Maurice and Lazare.

Professor Koch, the German bacteriologist, is making an exhaustive study of malaria in the hospitals of Milan. He intends to spend several months in Italy.

Jackson E. Reynolds, famous as a football player on the Pacific coast, has been appointed a member of the law faculty of his alma mater, Stanford university.

Robert W. Milligan, the chief engineer of the Oregon in her trip around Cape Horn, has since been transferred to the Brooklyn. He is a Pennsylvanian by birth.

A daughter of Professor Lombroso, the eminent criminologist, was recently acquitted by a Turin court on the charge of being a contributor to a condemned socialistic newspaper.

The Rev. Lorenzo Waugh of the Howard Street (San Francisco) Methodist Episcopal church is 90 years old and says he is the oldest Methodist Episcopal clergyman in the world.

Dr. Martia Van Buren Stevens, 71 years old, is a law student at the State university of Kansas. He expects to graduate next spring. He has already received degrees from other colleges.

Ex-Postmaster General Don M. Dickinson and Henry T. Thurber, formerly President Cleveland's private secretary, have dissolved the law partnership that has existed between them for about 15 years.

The Rev. E. K. Muller, who has gone back to South Africa on missionary work, was only recently ordained in Rome and is the first member of the Zulu race to enter the Roman Catholic church.

Not to be alarmed at the prospects of clouded titles, Samuel Webb of Texas has purchased an immense tract of land in eastern Cuba for cattle grazing and will shortly ship 2,500 head of Texas cattle there.

Prince Paul Esterhazy of Galantha, count of Edelstettin and Farchenstein, the jockey prince who died in Vienna recently, could boast of coming from a family that had twice refused the crown of Hungary.

Testing Cornstalk Pith.

The American consul general at St. Petersburg gives this account of a trial of cornstalk pith made by the Russian admiralty board on the proving grounds at Peligon, near St. Petersburg:

"A cofferdam 6 feet long, 6 feet deep and 3 feet broad was packed with blocks of cellulose made from the pith of Indian corn stalks. The material was supplied by an American corporation. A 6 inch solid shot was fired through the dam, striking it about 30 inches from the bottom. The shot passed clear through both the iron walls and the cellulose packing. Less than half a pound of cellulose was carried out by the projectile. The water compartment of the dam was filled, giving a pressure of nearly five feet of water on the perforated surface. In just half an hour a moist spot began to show on the outer surface of the dam, but it was evident the moisture had come along the bottom of the packing and not along the path

of the shot. In four hours no water had come through the shot's path.

"The experiment conclusively demonstrated that a ship provided with a cofferdam packed as was the one used in the experiment could be perforated five feet below the water line without the least danger of the entrance of water."

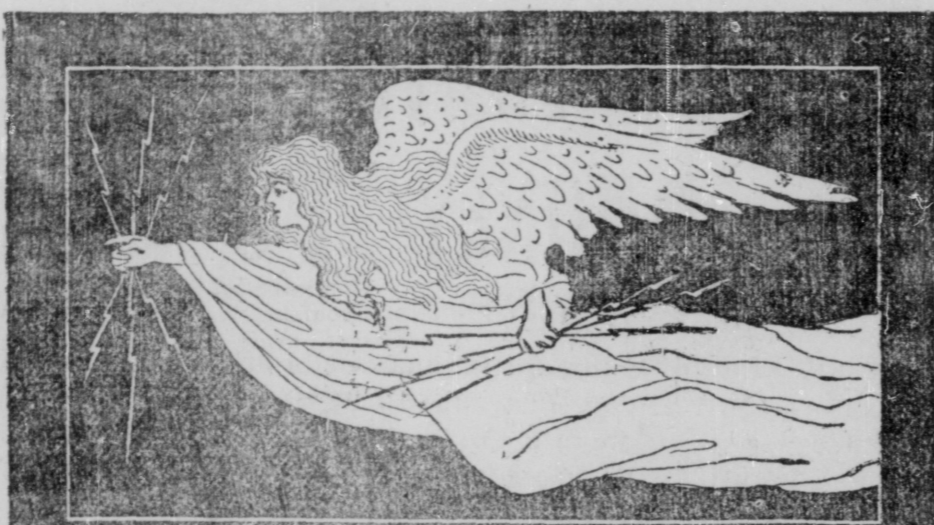
