



B.C. Hydro Report Carries Answer And Ammunition

By STEPHEN SCOTT VANCOUVER (CP) — Critics and friends of the British Columbia Hydro and Power Authority will find answers and ammunition in the annual report of the government-owned utility issued this week.

Hydro is a massive enterprise which sells electricity and natural gas, operates city and inter-city transportation and a small railway.

The Crown corporation is building two gigantic hydro developments on the northern Peace River (estimated eventual cost: \$700,000,000) and the southern Columbia River (\$350,000,000).

The New Democratic Party and at least one critic in eastern Canada have said the Social Credit government will run into trouble financing the Columbia project.

United States interests have paid the B.C. government \$273,291,661 for the downstream benefits from the three dams being built on the Columbia.

The government expects interest to bring this to \$300,000,000. By adding another \$50,000,000 Hydro figures to pay for the whole project as well as power facilities in one dam.

The NDP calculates that the government will run out of money before the end of the construction program. The government disagrees and the Hydro report shows the Columbia money is invested in short-term loans earning more than the five-per-cent interest needed to reach the \$500,000,000 figure.

The NDP also says the government is highly speculative, a project that will dwarf anything in North America in terms of size, cost and potential waste of resources.

"Its railroad and transit operations run at a loss," said Barron. "It has steadily reduced (electric) rates, notably to residential users, at the expense of profits."

The annual report showed a net income of \$7,470,263 compared with \$13,162,522 the previous year. Gross income was \$160,777,548, an increase of 4.9 per cent over the previous year.

The reduction in earnings was due in part to a reduction in electricity rates last April, the report said.

It said that in the last five years there have been gas and electricity rate reductions totalling \$22,100,000 annually. This included \$2,900,000 in gas rate reductions.

FACTS FOR FARMERS



Pasture Control And Early Cut Hay

Many of our Island farmers are making preparation for harvesting the 1966 hay crop. Some of the crop is already under cover. These farmers realize that high quality forage is probably the least expensive source of feed on the farm. Regardless of whether it is harvested for silage, or haylage or for hay, the forage you feed can be no more nutritious than the crop you harvest.

Today, there are more forage varieties, more efficient fertilizers, more cultural practices and more chemicals on the market. This means that we have much more "know-how" and the result is a push towards higher yields per acre.

High yields per acre are essential for economical production but what about quality. Too often, we still fail to recognize the need to cut forages early if we want high-quality feed. Top-quality forage may contain nearly as much total digestible nutrients as oats, barley or other concentrate feed.

Since about two-thirds of the feed value is in the leaves, early cut forages will be high in protein and total digestible nutrients and low in fibre. The time to cut hay is when the quality is high and when a fair crop is present. In general good yields of reasonable quality hay are obtained when the legumes are cut at the bud to early bloom stage and grasses at or just shortly after heading out.

ROTATION SYSTEMS Rotational grazing should not be omitted when managing a pasture. The rotational system on each farm may be different. It will also depend on the water supply. A good rotational system will have no less fields. The size of each field should be sufficient to provide grazing for up to a five-day period. If this type of a system is not possible then even a two or three field system will provide a rest for the pasture. The important thing to remember is not to overgraze. Legumes require a period between grazings to develop in late summer and to add to root reserves. If legumes are not given a chance to recover, especially during September and October they will not have as good a chance to survive the winter.

FERTILIZATION The rates of fertilizer listed below are for the average pasture on Prince Edward Island. For more exact recommendations, SOIL TEST SHOULD BE TAKEN Pastures with 20 to 30 per cent legumes should receive 500-700 lbs. of 5-20-20 in mid June. This can be supplemented with 150-300 pounds of ammonium nitrate or its equivalent to maintain production when required. Pastures with over 50 per cent legumes should receive 400

Although the pasture season is well under way, it is not too late to give your pasture fields some attention or good management.

There are several things which should be carried out if they are to give a longer period of time and produce the highest possible yield.

Early in the spring pasture should be harrowed to spread the droppings. This will give a better and more even coating of manure. Harrowing is not only useful during the spring but also during the summer and fall months. Chipping is one of the most important items this time of year. In order that there will be enough pasture during the hot, dry months of July and August, there usually is a surplus during May and June. Pasture should always be cut before the grasses begin to head. If pastures are cut at an early stage the growing point of the grasses will be below the cutting bar. This means that the growing point is not damaged and the grass will recover much more rapidly. If the grass develops heads and is then cut, the growing point will most likely be cut. When this happens the new growth has to grow from soil level which means very little regrowth. When cutting pastures, raise the cutting bar so that the white clovers will not be cut. Pastures should never be cut shorter than 6-8 inches. This heavy mat of forage will also help to hold moisture.

600 lbs. of 0-20-20 in early spring. Pastures which are mainly grass should receive 400-500 lbs. of 10-10-10 in mid June and 300-600 lbs. of 15-5-15 in early August.

Hay with 20 to 30 per cent legumes should receive 400-600 pounds of 6-12-12 in early spring. Immediately after the first cut apply 300-400 pounds of 15-5-15.

Grass pasture should receive 400-500 pounds of 10-10-10 in early spring and either 300-500 pounds of 15-5-15 or 150-300 pounds of ammonium nitrate with 125 pounds of muriate of potash after the first cut.

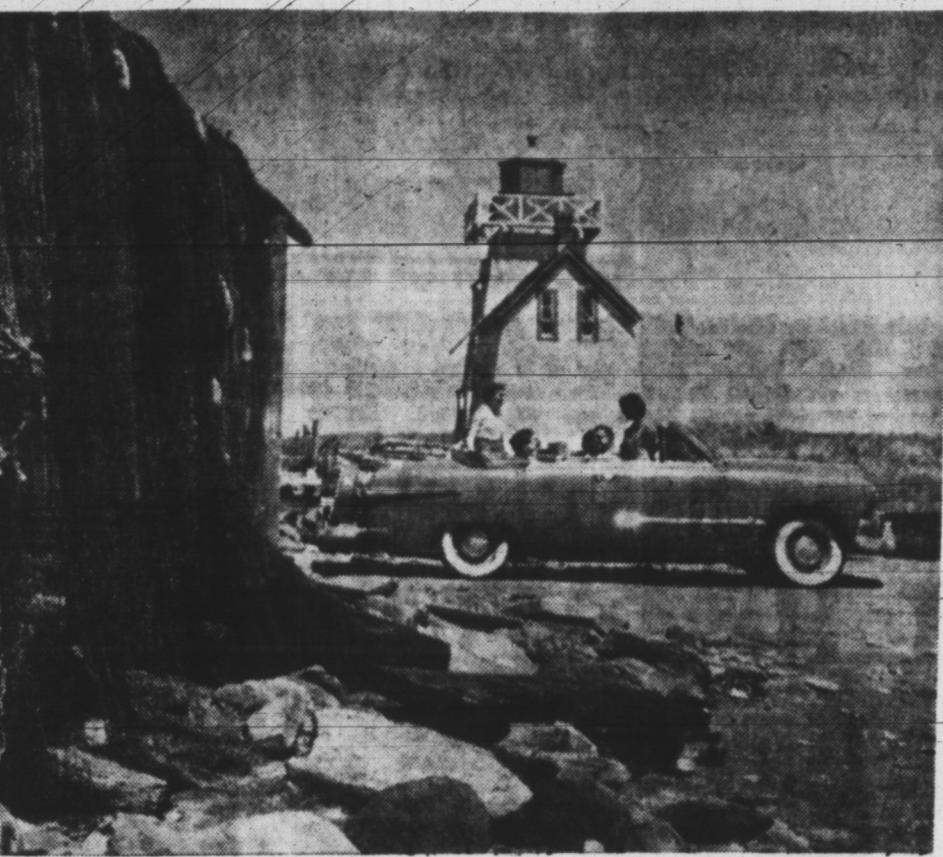
