TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

A Vote of Thanks to British Soldiers in Egypt.

EGYPTIAN WAR EXPENSES!

Annuities for Seymour and Wolseley.

LONDON, Oct. 27. The motion of vote of thanks to the British Army in Egypt was discussed at length in the House of Lords yesterday.

In the House of Commons yesterday, Sir Charles Dilke stated that no convention would be held with Great Britain and Egypt in the matter of the latter paying the cost of the British Army occupation in Egypt.

Mr. Gladstone, in his place in the Commons, yesterday, said it would be the duty of the Government to immediately propose suitable annuities for Admiral Seymour and General Sir Garnet Wolseley, who had accepted a peerage.

It is reported that Col. Warren, who has been searching for Professor Warren's party, sent to purchase Camels for the British Commissariat during the war, has proved that the whole party were murdered by order of Governor Nakhil. Warren's messengers were killed by hostile Bedouins.

ARABI'S SEIZED PAPERS.

ALEXANDRIA, Oct. 27. Arabi's papers, which were seized, show that a number of unsuspected officers of high rank have been found to be aiding Arabi in the Egyptian war.

The English Counsel refused to defend Mahmoud, Baroudi and Toulba Pashas, who have been accused of incendiarism at Alexandria.

Only one hundred and thirty persons are confined at Cairo. Reports from the interior of Egypt are to the effect that the report of ill-treatment of prisoners is exaggerated.

PARIS, Oct. 27. Small hopes are entertained of the recovery of the Bey of Tunis.

GENERAL CABLE NEWS.

PARIS, Oct. 25. The trial of the authors of the riots in Montecassino mines has been postponed until the next session of the court, owing to numerous attempts to intimidate the jury. It is reported the police discovered proofs of the existence of an international association for the destruction of property.

CAIRO, Oct. 25. The Khedive has sent a telegram to the Sultan congratulating him on the occasion of the festival of Bairam, begging a continuance of the Sultan's favor and protection, and expressing unaltered devotion and fidelity.

NEW YORK, Oct. 25. Professors Franz and Kobold arrived here yesterday en route to Aiken, S. C., where they will observe the transit of Venus for the German government.

LONDON, Oct. 25. The Daily News' Cairo correspondent says many persons of the highest rank in Turkey are deeply compromised by Arabi's correspondence.

BEGRAD, Oct. 25. The editor of a Socialist paper has been arrested in connexion with the attempted assassination of the King.

CAIRO, Oct. 25. Letters from Khartoum show that the Egyptian rule in southern Provinces, has received a disastrous, if not crushing, blow. There are incessant complaints in regard to the treatment of the families of rebel prisoners by the Khedive's employees.

Two notables, who are accused of aiding Arabi with money, are chained together in an underground dungeon foul beyond description.

LONDON, Oct. 25. The Swiss Ninet writes to the Times protesting that he only served Arabi in an ambulance. He gives a graphic account of the condition of his prisoners at Cairo. Thumb screws were put on him during the journey from Cairo to Alexandria.

Wilfred Blunt, telegraphing Napier, one of Arabi's counsel, relative to the discovery of Arabi's papers, says his success is assured.

STILLWATER, Minnesota, Oct. 25. Last night a farmer named Klingbite attacked his sleeping wife with a knife, cutting her horribly.

PARIS, Oct. 25. The Minister of Justice states that the Government have in their hands clues to a vast revolutionary organization, in accordance with which France is divided into local federations, directed by a committee having its headquarters in Geneva.

TRISTE, Oct. 25. It is believed that the cost of the war in Egypt will amount to nearly four million pounds, exclusive of the expense of the army of occupation and Indian contingent.

Gen. Wolseley and staff have arrived here on their way to England.

IN THE SUPREME COURT. In the matter of an Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the forty-fifth year of Her present Majesty's reign, Chapter 23, intitled, "An Act respecting Insolvent Banks, Insurance Companies, Loan Companies, Building Societies, and Trading Corporations, and of the President, Directors, and Company of the Bank of Prince Edward Island, an Insolvent Banking Company."
