

Find Explosion Was Accidental

MONTREAL (CP)—A coroner's jury in less than five minutes Thursday returned a verdict of accidental death in connection with the Aug. 28 explosion in suburban Ville Lasalle which killed seven persons.

With the verdict was a rider stating greater care should be exercised to avoid possibility of recurrence of mishaps because of ripped gas lines.

Much evidence concerned the depth of the line that was ripped by a grader. The explosion and fire that followed wrecked a block of four semi-detached houses.

ABOUT 10 INCHES DOWN
Emile Lavallee, foreman of the Jean Beaudry Construction Company, whose grader cut the line, testified the grader was operating at an 18-inch depth, normal for such work. He had only a quick glance at the broken pipe but did not think it was more than 10 inches deep.

Athanase Latour, municipal engineer for Ville Lasalle, testified the gas line should normally have been 33 to 36 inches deep although no municipal regulation requires this.

He said the line apparently was not deep enough and although Quebec Hydro furnished a plan of the section, it had not indicated the depth of feeder lines.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

West won the king of clubs and continued with the ace. South trumping. Three rounds of trumps, ending in dummy, were followed by South ruffing dummy's last club.

Declarer then took his three heart tricks and came down to the situation where he had to choose which opponent to finesse for the queen of diamonds. Enough clues had appeared during the play to make the result a foregone conclusion.

The third round of clubs and the three rounds of hearts had been played by South with the specific purpose in mind of compelling West to reveal, indirectly, his diamond holding. With the completion of these steps, West's hand became an open book.

West had started with three spades. He had followed to only two hearts. Also, West had proved to have started with seven clubs (East had shown up with precisely two). With twelve cards accounted for in three suits, West, therefore, must have been dealt exactly one diamond.

Accordingly, South led a diamond to the king. West playing the nine. Since this ominous card could not be anything but a singleton, South finessed the jack of diamonds on the return lead with the assurance that it would succeed.

West's orderly approach to the solution of the problem he was confronted with emphasized again the value of reconstructing the opponents' hands. Genuine guesses in bridge are few and far between.

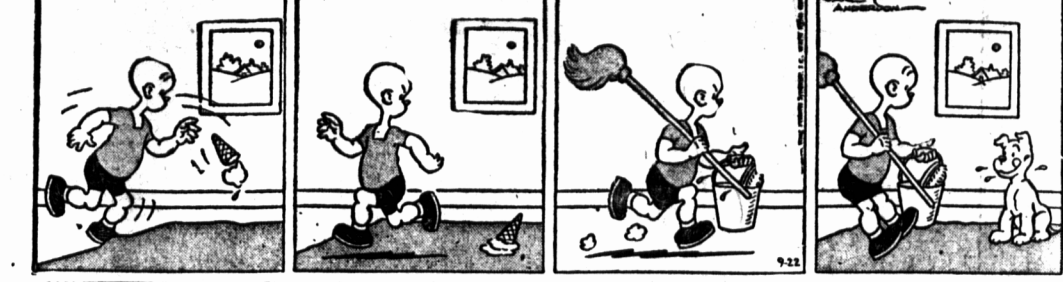
