Players, Coaches, Managers To Pick All-Star Ball Teams

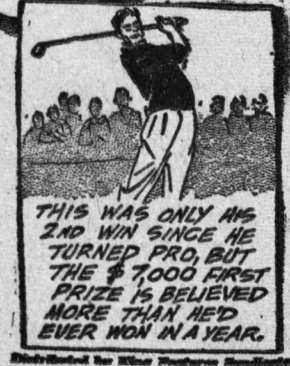
NEW YORK (AP)—Baseball Commissioner Ford Frick said Thursday the starting lineups of the 1958 all-star teams will be decided by a poll of players, managers and coaches of the two major leagues.
 Each player, manager or coach will be asked to vote for a team in his own league. He may not vote for players on his own team.
 Frick said the 16 player representatives agreed to cooperate in the plan. The 1958 game will be played at Baltimore July 8.
 Frick's announcement meant the end of the fan poll idea. Since 1947 the fans have voted for the eight starters in each league.
CAN'T BALANCE
 Obviously the 1957 poll in which Frick arbitrarily eliminated two Cincinnati players from the starting lineup after a deluge of Cincinnati ballots unbalanced the voting, was the basic reason for the change.
 "I have been in favor of the fan vote," said Frick. "But I am not in favor of the way it turned out. It has been a joke in recent years. The newspaper poll of fans simply is not practical. We do not get a true cross section and there is no way to balance it."
 Frick estimated the total vote

Redlegs Will Try New Caps

CINCINNATI (AP)—Cincinnati Redlegs, with a lot of firsts already to their credit, are going to try a new cap.
 The air conditioning consists of a water-cooled band made of aluminum foil and insulate sponges with a perforated cover inserted in the cap.
 The caps must be made of a material which is impervious to water, Paul said. One application of water is expected to retain the cooling quality for several hours.

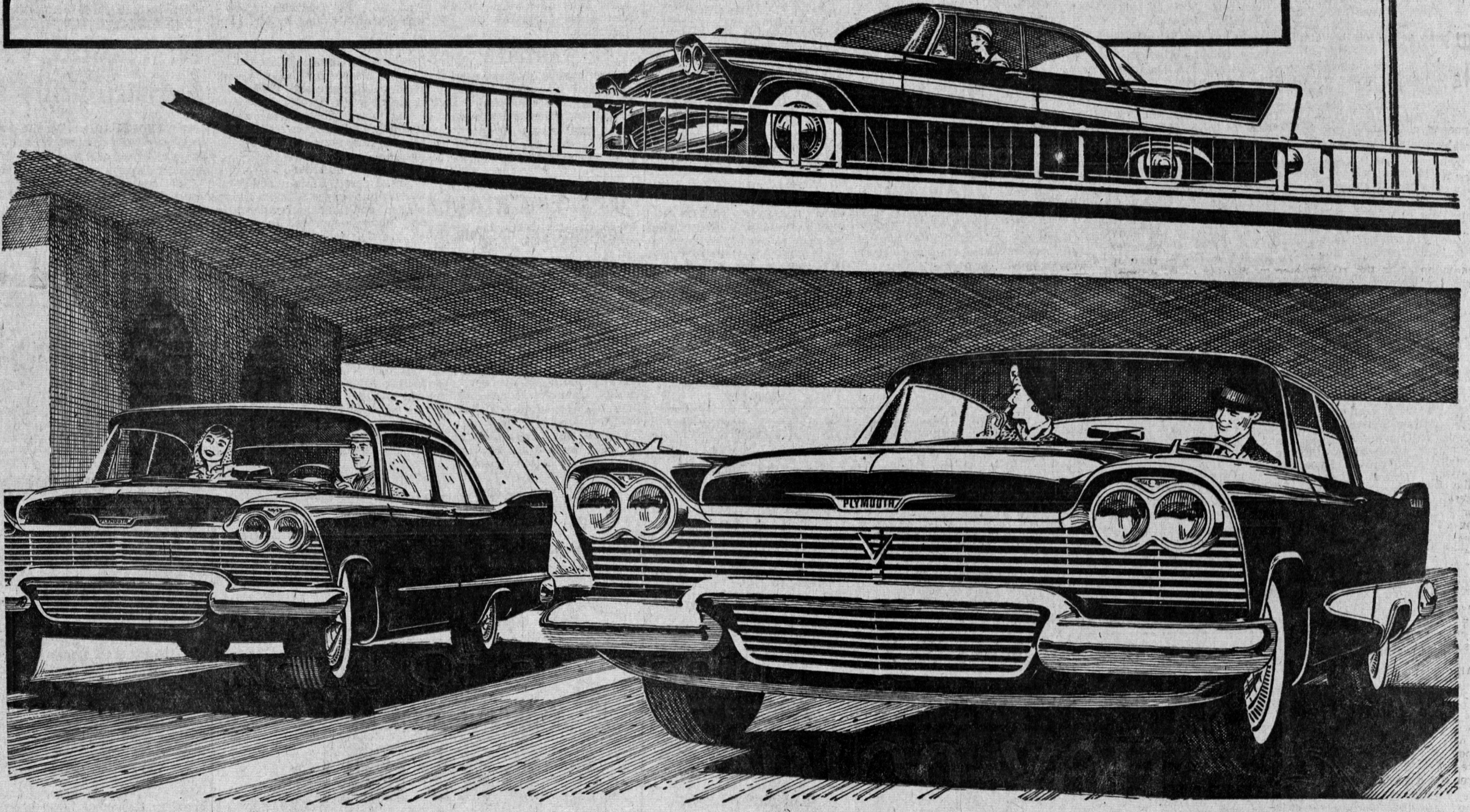

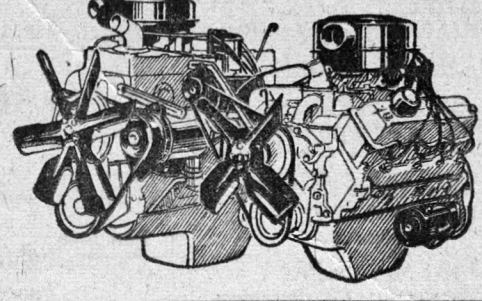
