

CLC Plans October Drive To Organize White Collars

OTTAWA (CP) — The Canadian Labor Congress next month will launch the second stage of its quiet but determined campaign to bring more of the country's white collar workers into the "rank of organized labor."
 A regional conference of unions interested in the white collar field has been called for Montreal Oct. 30-31. It will be the first in a series of such meetings across the country.
 Others are set for Regina Nov. 27-28, Vancouver Dec. 4-5, Toronto Jan. 16-17 and Halifax March 5-6.
 Main purpose of the conference is to bring together rank-and-file delegates from local white collar unions for a discussion of organizing problems and the techniques of solving them.
 In recent years CLC-affiliated unions have been making a "head-on" assault in the white collar field, organizing about 4,000 new members a year. But this has hardly kept pace with

the growth in this section of the labor force.
 Big retail firms, banks and insurance companies are the eventual targets of the new campaign.
MADE STUDY
 About a year ago a small group of CLC officials made a special study of the white collar situation and decided the time was ripe for a well-planned assault in this field. They drafted a long-range plan to develop the groundwork for it.
 Last January a conference was organized in Toronto to open discussions on an inter-union level. About 75 persons were expected but an astonishing 190 showed up.

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 These elements are part of the cosmic dust.
 Barker made them "speak up" in a way by bombarding samples of ocean-bottom sediments with neutrons. A small but known fraction of the atoms of iridium and osmium was thereby made radioactive, giving away their presence.
 Special techniques made it possible to calculate the original concentration of these elements, down to levels of less than one part in 10,000,000,000 parts of the sediment, and to calculate how much cosmic dust rains down annually, he explained.
 The figure comes to 100,000 tons a year, he said, or about 13 an hour. This agrees with several estimates of the rain of dust. But it is lower than some others, including those from hits measured on earth satellites by particles of space dust.
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 The group will study production and distribution of Canadian lumber and plywood in 11 cities and six provinces. World Said Gaining Weight At Rate Of 13 Tons Hourly

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. (AP) — A voice from the ocean bottom gossips the Mother Earth is gaining weight at a pretty good clip—about 13 tons every hour.
 This new weight comes from cosmic dust raining down all around the earth. It is composed of particles of matter—some of them microscopic—from burned up meteorites or shooting stars and from comets.
 The earth, wheeling through space, constantly runs into meteorites. So do man-made satel-

lites circling the earth. Space, in fact, is fairly dirty this way.
 A new way of estimating how much cosmic dust falls to earth was reported Tuesday to the American Chemical Society by John L. Barker Jr., a research assistant at the Enrico Fermi Institute for nuclear studies of the University of Chicago.
MEASURE TRACES
 He did it by measuring tiny traces of two little-known chemical elements—iridium and osmium—found in sediments at the bottom of the Pacific Ocean.
