Tourists From Canada Sought By Hungary

OTTAWA (CP)—The Hungarian Embassy said here Canadians of Hungarian descent can return to the Communist country for a visit without fear of trouble. Hungary is trying hard to develop a tourist industry and will welcome any Canadian visitor, First Secretary Istvan Varga said in an interview. Since the embassy was established April 1, at least 5,000 Canadians had visited Hungary. Only three had run into trouble and Mr. Varga said it wasn't political trouble. One was arrested for drunken driving and another in "a minor case" of smuggling. The embassy was concerned about publicity given the third case—that of Tibor Torma of Toronto, arrested last month after an incident in a Hungarian cafe. Mr. Varga said some "right-wing Hungarian organizations and newspapers, especially in Toronto" have suggested the arrest signalled trouble for any Hungarian going back for a visit. Mr. Torma left Hungary during the rebellion in 1956. The embassy said this had nothing to do with the arrest. Mr. Varga said he believes Mr. Torma may be tried this week, probably on a charge of causing a disturbance. "The Canadian public should not pay too much attention to two or three cases out of 5,000," he said. "Everyone is welcome in Hungary. We can assure you that if a visa is issued here, the only trouble you can get into is trouble made by yourself." Hungary had given amnesty in 1963 to all those who left the country during the 1956-57 uprising. Even most of those jailed in Hungary had been freed. The amnesty applied to the 30,000 Hungarians who had come to Canada. Only two to three per cent had been directly involved in the uprising anyway, Mr. Varga said. He said "right wing elements"—usually Hungarians who came to Canada shortly after the Second World War—have consistently opposed better relations between the countries. They had opposed establishment of diplomatic relations last year and now were trying to scare off Hungarians who would like to go back for a visit.

Ont. Finds Tire Studs Injure Roads

TORONTO (CP)—The Ontario highways department has tested tungsten-studded winter tires and found they can damage road surfaces, A. T. C. McNab, deputy highways minister, said here. Mr. McNab was commenting on a decision by the Greater Winnipeg Safety Council to ask the Manitoba legislature to make sure of the tires legal in that province. He said that while sale and use of the tires in Ontario is legal, damage is caused to road surfaces when a vehicle's brakes are applied. The studs do not damage roads when the vehicle is in motion. Mr. McNab said Ontario tests agreed with findings of tests in the United States where 22 states have banned the tires.

Vancouver Artist Gets Federal Job

OTTAWA (CP)—Vancouver artist Takao Tanabe has been awarded a \$25,000 federal contract to do a mural for the agriculture department's new headquarters, now under construction here, it was announced here. The design for the 80-by-20-foot mural was chosen from among three submitted by prominent Canadian artists, and will dominate the main foyer of the \$10,000,000 Sir John Casling building at the Central Experimental Farm. Mr. Tanabe's interpretation of the theme "Man, soil and climate" will be done on Japanese dip-dyed paper applied to low relief sculpture in his Vancouver studio. It will be shipped to Ottawa in small panels for final assembly, to coincide with the completion of the building in July, 1966. Mr. Tanabe, 39, is a native of Brooklyn Museum Art School, the Banff School of Art, the Central School of Arts and Crafts, London, and now teaches part time at the Vancouver School of Art.
