Following is the address:—To Mr. and Mrs. Wm. T. Connick and Family, Norborough, ocean.

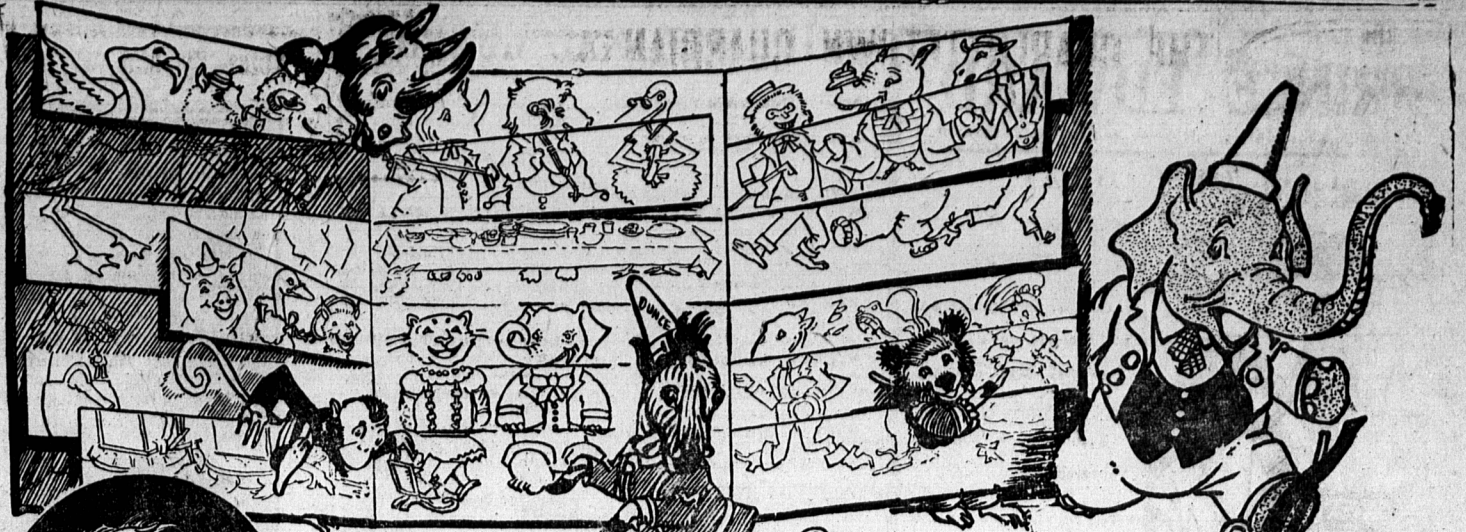
There are waves far out on the ocean. That will never break on the beach. So waves upon waves of emotion, Will find no expression in speech.
