ON Tuesday last Mr. Francis J. Conroy was, on motion of E. J. Hodgson, Esq., at the session of the Supreme Court in Summerside, admitted as an attorney-at-law. Mr. Conroy, we learn, passed a highly creditable examination. He studied in the office of Messrs. Hodgson & McLeod. We congratulate him on his success, and wish him a prosperous career.

At the meeting of the Licensing Board, held last evening, present: Messrs. Fraser, Curtis and Crabbe, renewals of license were granted to Messrs. Owen Connolly, Robert Crabb, James Edon, and Mrs. Elizabeth McCarror. A motion was carried to the effect that all householders eligible to vote be required to sign for or against the granting of licences to applicants.

OWING to the heavy winds which prevailed since yesterday morning, the Island steamers were detained at Summerside and Pictou yesterday. The "St. Lawrence" left Summerside this morning, but her arrival at Point du Chene has not yet been reported. At noon to-day the "Princess of Wales" was at Pictou, and up to our going to press her departure for this port was not reported.

THE attendance at the market to-day was very small, owing, no doubt, to the weather. Prices were as follows: Beef (small) from 5 to 12 cents per lb.; beef (gt.) from 4 to 7 cents; mutton, from 5 to 9 cents per lb.; lamb, from 4 to 9 cents per lb.; chickens, per pair, from 35 to 45 cents; Geese, from 40 to 50 cts.; ducks, 40 to 60 cents per pair; butter (fresh) from 16 to 20 cents per lb.; butter (tub) from 13 to 15 cents, potatoes, from 20 to 25 cts.; oats, 32 to 33 cts.; hay, from 35 to 40 cts; flour, from \$2.90 to \$3.00 per 100 lbs; oatmeal, from \$2.75 to \$3.00.

QUEEN'S OWN ROYAL DUBLIN CITY REGIMENT.—Lieutenant Stuart Stephens reported at headquarters yesterday, his arrival from Zululand. This officer was employed at the commencement of the war in superintending the works for the defence of Pietermaritzburg. He afterwards commanded the Natal Native Pioneers at the Lower Tugela from February to the end of June, except during the month of April, when he was attached to the third Battalion 60th Rifles at the relief of Isthoni and Ginginhlo. Lieutenant Stephens was thanked by the Ordnance Department at the Lower Tugela for important services rendered by him to that department at a critical period. —*Irish Times*.

HARSH TREATMENT OF A CHILD.—A correspondent of the *Summerside Progress*, writing from Augustine Cove, complains of the manner in which some of the children attending a school in that locality, are treated. If one half of what the correspondent says be true, the case should be enquired into by the Inspector of Schools. Referring to one case of harsh treatment he says:—"At one time the little boy was placed standing on the stove with a basket placed on his head and a bough in each hand, an object of ridicule to both teacher and scholars. The child, who is of a nervous temperament, was frightened almost beyond control of himself, and when by the crying and pleading of his sister he was taken down from his position, he was seized with a twitching in his face which has gone all over his body, and has proved, I believe, to be St. Vitus's Dance; caused by cold to his feet (which were bare), and fright, which would bring such on stronger persons, much less a weak-nerved child.

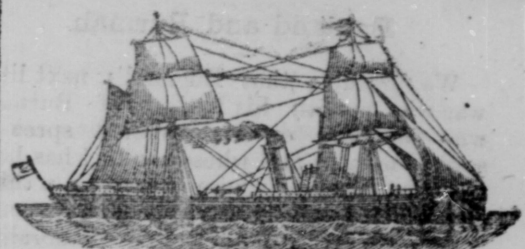
