

Recover Stolen Treasures Youths Took From Museum

NEW YORK (AP)—Police Tuesday recovered three of the missing priceless silver figurines stolen from the Brooklyn Museum Saturday. They described the theft as the devilry of two teen-age cousins.

Detectives said the boys, both 14-year-old high school students, didn't realize the enormity of what they had done until they read about it in the newspapers.

Frightened, they scattered the eight tiny pieces of sculpture around the neighborhood of the Red Hook housing project where they live.

Later, one of the cousins went out and recovered two of the art pieces. These were turned over to police, as was a third one, found by a woman in a nearby gutter.

Detectives planned a door-to-door canvass of 2,000 apartments in the 20-building housing development.

Because of the youths' age, police did not identify them. They were charged as juvenile delinquents and sent home in their parents' custody pending a court appearance.

Britain Wants Scientists To Stay Home

LONDON (CP)—Britain is looking for 50 senior scientists to stay at home while others are in the Pacific testing atomic weapons.

The Atomic Energy Authority, a recently-created government department, has asked the admiralty and the ministry of supply to scout around other government departments for mathematical physicists, astrophysicists, statisticians and

design engineers.

They will stay in Britain "to assist the scientific effort in the weapons group of AEA." Britain plans atomic tests in the Monte Bello Islands next April and in the central Australian desert later in the year.

The search is another symptom of an acute scientist shortage. A plan is being devised to encourage youngsters to stick to their school books and become scientists to ease the shortage.

To get the 50 scientists, volunteers are being guaranteed two years' work with AEA. During that time, their old jobs will be kept for them and any promotions they might have got will be held open.

Toronto Bible Sales Soar

TORONTO (CP)—Evangelist Billy Graham said Tuesday night Toronto bookstores have sold more Bibles in the last few days than during the first nine months of the year.

In his address to 12,500 persons attending a Graham crusade rally at the Canadian National Exhibition grounds, the evangelist said several bookstores had called him and told him this.

He urged his audience to get a Bible with big print and read it. He advocated the King James version and a modern edition as well. "The Bible contains God's love

letters to mankind," he said. After 276 members of the audience came forward to "make decisions for Christ," Graham said the full impact of the decision is not felt in the lives of those who come forward for from three to five years.

He compared their "spiritual birth" to their physical birth. "They are as babies, needing tender, loving care. They have to grow. Some of them will stumble and fall."
