Did this young medical student's dream come true? It did. He became famous and married a beautiful girl, and behind that marriage lies a story as tragic as any in the wards of the hospital founded by Dr. Marsden. Why? Because she was stricken with cancer and nothing could then be done to check the disease. Out of her death and the death of the dying girl picked up on the doorstep that night in London almost a century ago sprang this splendid work that shines like a heavenly star over London.

The kindest act I ever witnessed took place some 20 years ago when this scribe lived in Lorne Valley, P. E. I.
One evening a blind and dirty tramp who had been getting the cold shoulder at most places dropped in at the farm home of the late Allen MacSwain and asked for a bite to eat and a place to sleep.

MORAL QUALITIES

Almost startling is the reflection with which St. John closes the second chapter of his Gospel: "Now when (Jesus) was in Jerusalem at the Passover feast, many believed in His name when they saw His signs which He did; but Jesus did not trust Himself to them, because He knew all men and needed no one to bear witness of man; for He Himself knew what was in man."

How different the history of our time would have been if Neville Chamberlain had known what was in Hitler and if F. D. Roosevelt had known what was in Stalin when they were negotiating with these totalitarian leaders.

Chamberlain had such a high sense of honor that he couldn't imagine a statesman base enough to break a pact right after signing it.

When Hitler violated the agreement which the two had just made, Chamberlain remarked that he thought Hitler would keep a treaty made by himself even though he broke those made by others.

A historian of the World War II tells us that when Churchill and Roosevelt were about to meet Stalin, Roosevelt said to Churchill: "Let me deal with Stalin."

Evidently Roosevelt believed that if he could persuade Stalin to agree to certain policies, he had him. What he did not know later events proved, viz. that Stalin had no intention of keeping any agreement that would interfere with his own designs for the conquest of Europe, but would go his own way regardless.

The free world's two champions of freedom committed themselves to men without knowing what was in them, and the full consequences only history will show.

The Gospels abound in examples of Jesus' insight into the character of the people around Him.

For example, He saw Peter's possibilities the moment He looked at him, and called him "Rock" when his companions thought of him as impulsive and unsteady. He read Judas through and through as soon as Judas began to doubt Him, and warned him again and again of the danger ahead of him. We hear a great deal about how He understood His enemies; more
