Space Agency Urges No Cut In Moon Funds

WASHINGTON (AP)—James E. Wood's U.S. space agency chief said today that unless full budget requests are granted it will be impossible to achieve the goal of exploring the moon with men in the next five years.

Testing before the Senate panel of the moon program. Webb said the money requested—\$3,000,000 for the next five years—was a cut from \$4,000,000 for the current year—represent a "tight budget situation."

"If we do not receive the funds which the president has requested there is nothing left to sacrifice except the national goal itself," the head of National Aeronautics and Space Administration said.

Webb added that if the Apollo lunar landing program is stretched into the next decade the cost will increase by about \$1,000,000,000 for each year the landing is delayed.
