The last issue of the Canada Gazette contains a return of the comparative efficiency of the 821 Battalion, of Prince Edward Island, occupying a good position, the average being 94.57.

With reference to the tunnel borings, it has been ascertained that a considerable amount is due the workmen who were employed, and the Minister of Finance has said that, although the Government are not legally bound to pay those men, there is a possibility that they have a moral claim that will have to be considered by the Government.

News Notes.

The break in the cotton strike at Oldham by which 250,000 spinners have been usually heard about big labour struggles in America. Where they get too great they burst.

The National League of America has issued an address to the Irish denouncing Gladstone's home rule bill as "a clever piece of finance juggling" and declaring that a sovereign parliament in Ireland with complete control over their own affairs and not subject to the caprice of the English parties, should alone be acceptable to the Irish people.

The United States Navy will for the next four years be in charge of a southern man who thirty years ago was in arms against the government. Mr. Herbert is the first man who was in the confederate army to be appointed to the administration of either of the national war departments.

Newfoundland's trade in 1891 is shown by official returns just received. The total imports were \$6,809,458, compared with \$5,308,855 the year before; exports amounted to \$7,437,153 against \$5,090,986 in 1891, a very considerable increase.
