## Impaired Charge Is Dismissed



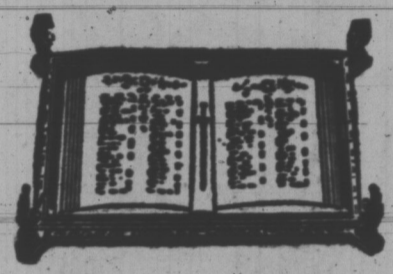
