Pianist Debut Is Sensation

 LONDON (CP) — Glenn Gould's London debut isn't until tonight but Tuesday night a covey of slack-jawed reporters and photographers were ready to concede they've never seen anyone quite like him before.
 The 26-year-old Toronto pianist is making his first appearance at the Royal Festival Hall in a series of five Beethoven concerts during the next week.
 During a rehearsal and press reception Tuesday Gould displayed some of his eccentricities to the score of photographers present.
 He rose from his special old battered chair with sawed off legs in the Royal Festival Hall during the rehearsal and touched off a volley of camera shots.
 "I don't want to play any more," he said to conductor Josef Krips of the London Symphony Orchestra.
 The conductor put down his baton and the musicians filed out of the concert hall.
 "Nothing like him has ever hit this place before," commented a violinist as he went out.
 Gould obligingly posed for more photographs with the conductor before moving into the celebrities' foyer for the press reception. He appeared wearing a baggy grey suit, a grey shirt with his necktie awry and a sweater that sagged below his hips. On his hands were the mittens and leather palm-gloves.
 "I have to protect my hands," he said, sipping orange juice. "They're sensitive to this pressurized air — this pushed and cold air that you get in these air-conditioned buildings."
