Castro Killing Termed Goal

SANTIAGO DE CUBA (AP)— Reports circulated here Saturday that 16 sailors arrested for plotting against the government also planned to assassinate Premier Fidel Castro.

One unofficial report said the plotters had planned to kill Castro Nov. 30 when he arrived here to participate in observances commemorating the anniversary of his uprising against ex-dictator Fulgencio Batista. It said the plan was upset because Castro arrived by road instead of by air, as expected.

All the sailors were arrested Nov. 30, a few minutes before Castro's arrival. They are held on charges of plotting against the state, but what they plotted has not been specified.

Agreement Is Reached In Minnesota Strike

ALBERT LEA, Minn. (AP)— Minnesota Governor Orville Freeman announced Sunday agreement has been reached between Wilson and Company and the striking United Packinghouse Workers union to resume negotiations "very soon."

The announcement came as the first break in the long dispute over working conditions that erupted into violent demonstrations in this southern Minnesota city last week and put the community under martial law.

Freeman said Wilson President James Cooney and union president Ralph Helstein agreed to the ground rules for resumption of talks after lengthy telephone conversations between them and an Albert Lea minister. The minister, Dr. Lloyd Peterson of the First Presbyterian Church, declined to give details. He said, however, the company was given assurances it asked for from the union. Freeman said the new development would not change the status quo in Albert Lea, where the Wilson meat packing plant is shut down and the national guard state militia has taken over law enforcement. Constantine Rated Idol Of French Film Fans

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Eddie Constantine is one of the idols of the French movies. He's often called the Humphrey Bogart of France.

At the box office, he is a male Brigitte Bardot. But a dozen years ago, the Los Angeles-born Constantine was getting nowhere in American films. "I used to sing in the chorus of movies like 'Born to Dance' with Eleanor Powell," he recalls. He didn't go to the Brown Derby in those days; he couldn't afford even to park his car in its lot. And that's what made an incident the other day so memorable for him.

Back for a television appearance, he was sitting in a booth in the famous Hollywood restaurant when he was paged over the loudspeaker "Telephone for Mr. Eddie Constantine."

SUCCESS AT LAST
A waiter brought the telephone to his table. It was Gene Kelly inviting him to a party. "You can't imagine what a tremendous thrill this is," he told Kelly over the phone. "Being paged in the Brown Derby by Gene Kelly."

He added later to his companion: "And I am actually here, drinking creme de menthe and soda." This led up to his statement that he is one of the main reasons why you now can buy whisky in French bistros. He says when he first went to Paris in 1947, it was almost impossible to get whisky except near hotels that catered to American and British tourists.

Museum At Montague To Receive Collection

MONTAGUE — The private collection of museum pieces of the late A.J. Matheson of O'Leary, is to be presented to the Garden of the Gulf Museum. This is one of the most treasured collections in the province and a spokesman for the Montague Board of Trade, founders of the Island's only museum, said they were fortunate indeed, and expressed deep appreciation to Mrs. A.J. Matheson for her generosity in loaning such a fine collection to the museum. Part of the collection has already been received. It was brought to Montague by the late Mr. Matheson's son, Keith, and the official presentation of the entire collection will take place in the near future.

W. A. Hyndman Is Promoted To Royal Bank Western Post

The promotion of W.A. Hyndman, son of A.W. Hyndman of Charlottetown, to the important post of supervisor of branches of the Royal Bank of Canada in Saskatchewan, with headquarters in Regina, is announced by the bank's head office today. Mr. Hyndman has been manager of the bank's Calgary main branch since 1952.

Born in Edmonton, Alta., where his father was manager of the Edmonton Branch of the bank, he came to Charlottetown in 1909 when his father became manager of the Charlottetown Branch, a position from which the latter retired in 1939.

Mr. Hyndman attended West Kent School and Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown, and King's College, Windsor, N.S., entering the Royal Bank at Charlottetown in 1927. He spent his early banking years in the Maritime Provinces, being assistant manager at Halifax, N.S., from 1940 to 1944 and later serving as inspector at head office in Montreal.

During 1945 and 1946, Mr. Hyndman was engaged in special work connected with the re-establishment of returning servicemen. In 1946 he was named manager of the main branch at Edmonton, Alta., and six years later moved to Calgary.

PARISIAN APPEAL
One French actor, now in Hollywood, describes Constantine's appeal thusly: "He speaks pure Parisian French with a touch of American accent. The combination makes it all sound sexy — just like Charles Boyer's effect on American women a few years ago." Constantine has analyzed his own success too. "In the French character, there is no one who quite acts or looks like me. A Frenchman doesn't look natural playing an American gangster. And French audiences love American gangsters."
