CONVICTIONS.

James E. Kelly, of Fort Augustus, was, on Thursday, the 21st inst., convicted and fined before J. R. Bourke and P. M. Bourke, Esquires, two of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for Queen's County, in the sum of five pounds, with costs, for retailing spirituous liquors in less quantities than one pint.

On the same day, and before the same, John Kelly, of Monaghan Road, was convicted and fined in the sum of forty shillings with costs, for retailing spirituous liquors on the Lord's day.

On the same day, and by the same, Andrew Fraser was convicted and fined in the sum of five shillings, with costs, for an assault on Robert Vaudeerstine, fine to be paid in 10 days or 14 days imprisonment.
