Civil Service Gets Replies From 51 Federal Candidates OTTAWA (CP) - The Civil Service Federation of Canada has received 51 replies to the more than 1,000 letters it sent candidates in the federal election asking them to state their position on collective bargaining in the public service. The 80,000-member federation said in a statement Friday it has not heard directly from any of the party leaders. This was "somewhat disappointing since it is the leader of the party who can speak most authoritatively on the question." In a six-point questionnaire sent to all candidates Oct. 25, the federation sought assurance that: 1. The candidate's party, if elected, would introduce collective bargaining; 2. That the federation would have a chance to discuss any such system before its implementation; and 3. That the organization or combination of organizations representing the majority of employees in the public service would be the certified bargaining agent. In its statement Friday the federation said Prime Minister Pearson's office gave assurance that bargaining legislation would be introduced at the "earliest opportunity," but it "would be difficult for the prime minister to give detailed assurances on all the specific and important points raised in your letter until the government has completed its full examination of the report of the preparatory committee." The statement said spokesmen for the Liberal, Conservative, New Democratic and Social Credit parties, in fact, all of the 51 replies, "supported collective bargaining." The number of replies by party: Liberal 6; Conservative 7; NDP 3; Social Credit 2; Creditist 2.

Perjury Case Is Dismissed ST. JOHNS, Que. (CP) - Perjury charges against chiropractor Roch Deslauriers, who testified against Yvon Dupuis at the former Liberal Cabinet minister's preliminary hearing on influence-peddling charges, were dismissed Friday. Judge Henrius Michaud ruled that the Crown had not presented sufficient proof to warrant a trial for Deslauriers. The perjury charges were laid by Montreal businessman René Rousseau because of the chiropractor's testimony at the Dupuis hearing. Mr. Dupuis, facing re-election Monday in St. Jean - Ilerveville - Napierville has been ordered to stand trial at the January sittings in Sherbrooke. The influence-peddling charges allege that he asked for and accepted \$10,000 to be used in support of a group seeking to build a racetrack in his constituency in 1961. The racetrack permit was never granted. Mr. Dupuis left the Cabinet in January at Prime Minister Pearson's request and the federal party since has designated Jean Desmarais, a former St. standard-bearer in the riding.
