At present there are ten rooms in use, six on the first floor, three in the basement, and one room elsewhere in the town. With the large grade one enrolment, a division of this grade is necessary, and as a consequence another room and teacher will be needed, making eleven rooms in use during the present year.

SEOUL, Sept. 3 - (Wednesday) - (AP) - Chinese Communist troops, appearing out of the mist and rain on the Western Korean front, Tuesday tested Allied defenses at Bunker and Siberia hills and at Old Baldy. The probes were light but they showed the interest the Communists still show in the hill positions which they lost in violent summer fighting. About 400 Chinese attempted a raid on Old Baldy. They moved out behind a heavy volume of mortar fire as the rain poured down. They were driven off after a brief skirmish. The probes at Bunker and Siberia hills, to the southwest of Old Baldy, were even lighter. Rains kept air action to a minimum.
