Believe Waterspout Is Signed Near Alberton

On Saturday morning a number of fishermen and residents of Alberton saw what is believed to have been a waterspout, an unusual phenomenon of nature for this locality, located about a mile out to sea due east of Alberton harbour. The object, which was visible for over an hour, consisted of a dense black cloud of considerable diameter extending down to the water and on examination through field glasses appeared to be a heavy swirling column of water rising to a considerable height.

Two Alberton South fishermen, George McBeth and Melvin Albert sailed quite near of water and said there was a heavy fall of water back into the sea. Mr. McBeth believed that if their boat had been any nearer they could have been in serious difficulties from the turbulence of the sea and the heavy discharge of water.

Although a most unusual event, an elderly resident of Alberton South recalled a similar occurrence about fifty years ago.

Although the whole top of the car was badly smashed in by the impact, the girls escaped injury with the exception of two minor cuts to the arm of Miss Mailman and they were able to crawl out of the car through the left front window.
