The present movement aims to awaken the more the interest of our ministers, of our sessions and of our people—to reach the hearts and homes of all—to revive personal piety and family religion—to stir up our church organizations among the young—to enlist a sympathetic desire, prayer, resolve, effort and cooperation in all to the end of stimulating the life and work of the church.

As congregations we must not look too much to outside help except that which comes from God as our noble resolutions develop into practical work. We would urge sessions to carefully consider the questions of the assembly's committee on church life and work and suggest the reading of these questions from all our pulpits which could not well fail to make a favorable impression. As a pastor and session you will soon be conferred with by the Committee of your district, which committee will report the action taken and work done in the district to the convener on church life and work in time for him to embody it in his report to the Presbytery at the quarterly meeting in February.

May "the Lord stir up the spirit" of His servants and "the spirit of all the remnant of the people," that they come and do "work in the House of the Lord of Hosts." In the name and on behalf of the Presbytery.

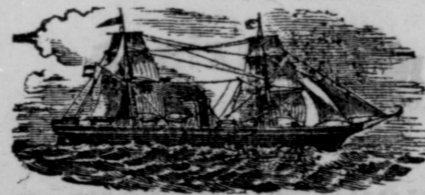
