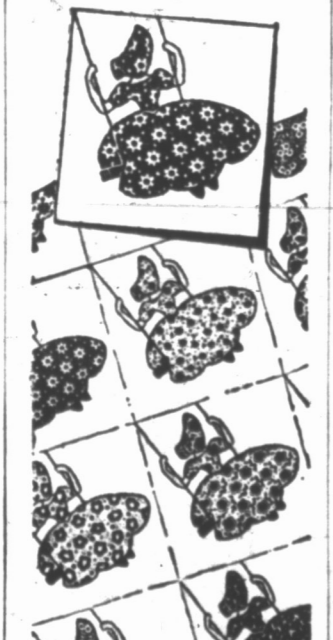

A GOOD restaurateur buys all foods from the top joints of quality and price. Pennies are precious to him, just as they should be to every homemaker.

DEEP-DISH CHERRY-FILBERT PIE

1 recipe American flaky pie crust or a mix 1 tsp. fine dry bread crumbs 2 (No. 1) cans pitted sour cherries 1 c. sugar 1 1/2 tsp. flour 1/2 tsp. salt 2 tsp. ground cinnamon 2 tsp. fruit juice, any kind

Nut topping (follows) Roll pastry a scant 1/4" thick on lightly floured surface. Line well-buttered 1 1/2-qt. baking dish (preferably square) with pastry. Press it well down over edge of dish. Dust with crumbs; press in lightly.

Stir together cherries, sugar, flour, salt, cinnamon and fruit juice; pour into pastry-lined dish. Bake 10 min. in hot oven (400 degrees F.); reduce heat to 375 degrees F.; bake 20 min. Remove from oven. Spread with Nut Topping and bake 10 min. more.

Nut topping: Combine 1/4 c. fine-chopped filberts, 1/4 c. flour, 3 tsp. brown sugar, 1/2 tsp. cinnamon and 1/4 c. firm margarine or butter. Chop and mix with pastry blender or back and edge of spoon to make crumbs.

TOSSED NOODLES ITALIAN FROM THE CHEF Cook 1 lb. broad noodles following pkg. directions. Drain. Barely melt 1/4 c. butter in large skillet. Add noodles and 1/4 c. grated Parmesan cheese. Gently heat, tossing with 2 tsp. heavy cream until noodles are evenly covered, shiny and hot.
