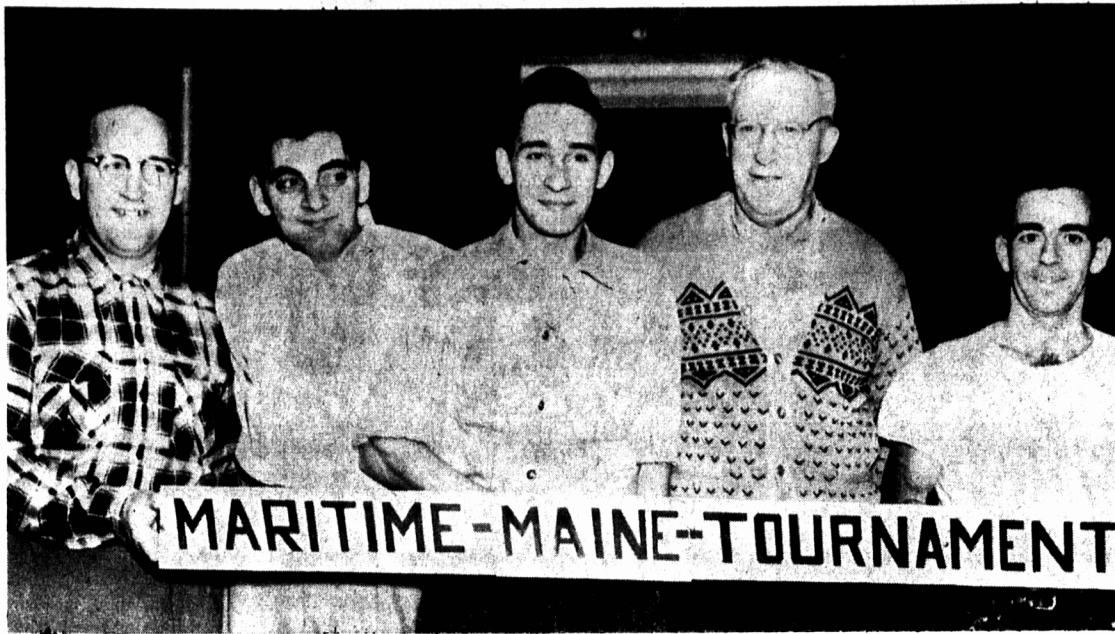

Igor Gouzenko Finds Heroine And Scene In Canada For Second Book

TORONTO (CP)—Igor Gouzenko, the former Soviet code clerk who wrote a successful first novel about his own country, has found a heroine and a scene in Canada for his second book.

Part of the theme of "Ruth Cameron," the novel he is writing now, is drawn from his experiences in the Russian embassy at Ottawa where nine years ago he disclosed a Red spy ring in Canada.

After his first novel, "The Fall of a Titan," was published this summer, Gouzenko and his pretty blonde wife, Svetlana, took their two children on a trip. Somewhere along the way he met Ruth Cameron's real-life counterpart and some of the minor characters for his new book.

In the early drafts of the book, Ruth falls in love with a faltering Soviet agent in Canada whose superiors are putting pressure on him through threats to torture his family at home. The writer calls the Canadian girl "the personification of the free world."

For the 35-year-old Gouzenko, writing a novel is sheer physical labor. He scribbles as many as three drafts in Russian longhand, then corrects successive transla-

tions. He fixes his characters in his mind by drawing sketches or he uses people he has known in real life.

In "The Fall of a Titan," a 300,000-word novel based on intrigue in the Communist hierarchy of post-revolutionary Russia, the various drafts amounted to 2,000,000 words.

The Gouzenkos live somewhere in Canada, shielded from possible Communist vengeance by false names and nationalities. Even their intimate friends don't know their address.

Gouzenko's own feeling is that "The Fall of a Titan," with its portrayal of the misery and brutality of life under communism, has not lessened the danger of Soviet reprisal.

Apart from the direct threat of secret agents, the Gouzenkos fear the "pinks" and the cranks who could scarcely rate as Communist sympathizers.

To Gouzenko, the Communist threat is a real one and he refuses to take his freedom for granted. He still hopes the Canadian and United States government will put into effect the plan he broached a year ago to cause further defections among Soviet agents by offering them protection and security.

"To preserve freedom all of us must take active part in its defence," he told a reporter. "When the Soviet guards slam the doors against you in the cattle car to take you off to concentration camp, as it did happen to many in Estonia or Poland, it will be too late."

N.H.L. Games Saturday

TORONTO (CP)—Toronto Maple Leafs broke loose with four goals in the second period Saturday night to hang up a 5-2 win over Chicago Black Hawks in a National Hockey League game.

The game featured the big-time 1952-53 season and scored 29 goals for Pittsburgh last year, scored with a sizzling slap-shot into the lower corner. He took Tod Sloan's passout from behind the Chicago net.

MONTREAL (CP)—Bernie (Boom-Boom) Geoffrion scored the 99th and 100th goals of his National Hockey League career Saturday night to lead Montreal Canadiens to a 4-1 victory over Detroit Red Wings.

Playing in his fifth season after moving up directly from junior ranks, Geoffrion's goals kept him on top of the NHL scoring parade and were enough to put Montreal into sole possession of first place over Detroit. The two goals ran Geoffrion's total to 11 for the season, and along with four assists gave him a total of 15 points.

The Red Wings were minus their ace, Gordie Howe, because of an injury and Metro Prystal took over the big rightwinger's place.

Ken Mosdell, veteran Montreal centre, and rookie Eddie Litzenberger completed the Montreal scoring. Detroit's goal was scored by Vic Stasiuk in the first period.
