1,500 U.S. Demonstrators March Through Volleys

CHICAGO (AP) — A line of 1,500 civil rights demonstrators marched in the rain through volleys of rocks, cherry bombs and bottles Sunday to kneel and pray in front of two churches in an all-white neighborhood on Chicago's northwest side.

Chicago has an open occupancy law and Governor Otto Kerner has issued an executive order forbidding real-estate agents from discriminating in the sale or rental of housing. The order is being appealed in courts.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey raised the possibility Sunday that unless business, industry and unions show some "self discipline" on wage and price issues, it could lead to anti-strike legislation by Congress.

He agreed with a statement made Saturday by the presidential economic adviser, Gardner Ackley, that, in a total economy of more than \$700,000,000,000, a steel price increase amounting to something like \$300,000,000 was not significant.
