

Yankees Down Orioles Dodgers Defeat Giants

BALTIMORE (AP) — Mickey Mantle hit a bases-empty homer in the 10th inning Monday night as the league-leading New York Yankees slapped down the surging Baltimore Orioles, 3-2.

The 380-foot homer off ace reliever George Zuverink was Mantle's 22nd of the season but only the second he has hit in the Baltimore park during the last two seasons.

NEW YORK (AP) — Brooklyn's Don Drysdale snapped a month-long slump with a five-hitter Monday night for 3-0 victory over New York Giants. It was the 20-year-old right-hander's sixth triumph out first in seven starts since June 5, when he shut out Chicago Cubs.

Drysdale, now 6-5, pitched with a 1-0 lead for seven innings after the Dodgers' lead off batter, Junior Gilliam, had lofted a home run off loser Johnny Antonelli that grazed the left field scoreboard for his first of the season.

CLEVELAND (AP) — Kansas City Athletics snapped an 11-game losing streak Monday night by walloping Cleveland Indians 10-3. A three-run homer by Tim Thompson helped Tom Gorman post his first victory.

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Philadelphia Phillies, held to but three hits over the first seven frames, rallied for five runs in the eighth Monday night to snap a five-game losing streak with a 5-4 victory over Pittsburgh Pirates.

Pirate starter Ronnie Kline was coasting along on a 4-0 lead until the Phil opened up in the eighth. Bob Smith took over on the mound after Kline gave up two runs on two singles and a double and a hit batsman.

DETROIT (AP) — Al Kaline's sixth inning home run touched off a three-run Detroit rally that broke a 2-2 tie and carried the Tigers to a 5-2 triumph over Chicago White Sox before 40,833 spectators Monday night.

The loss dropped the White Sox two full games behind the league-leading New York Yankees who beat Baltimore 3-2 in 10 innings.

CHICAGO (AP) — Rookie Dick Drott, celebrating his twenty first birthday Monday, joined some classy company as he blanked Cincinnati on four scattered singles in pitching Chicago Cubs to a 6-0 victory over the Redlegs.

It was the Redlegs' fourth shut out loss of the year, as they were zeroed earlier by Lew Burdette, Warren Spahn, and Don Newcombe.

Thus Drott gained his seventh victory against as many losses, and marked his second conquest via the shutout route. His sixth win was a 9-0 blanking of Philadelphia here June 19 when he allowed only three hits.

Drott, a native of Cincinnati, fanned eight and walked three as he strike out total soared to 86 off his first 104 innings in the majors.

The Cubs jumped on loser Joe Nuxhall with a quick 3-0 lead in the first as Bobby Morgan singled; Jerry Kindall and Ernie Banks blasted doubles, and Jim Bolger, another Cincinnati native, smacked a triple.

The Cubs' fourth run off Nuxhall, a two-time winner who suffered his fifth loss, was Moose Moryn's 10th homer with two out in the third.

Chicago added single runs in the sixth when catcher Cal Neeman doubled to score Moryn, who had three of the Cubs' 10 hits, and the sixth run resulted from Moryn's leadoff double in the eighth.

The Braves stayed one-half game ahead of second-place Cincinnati, defeated 6-0 by Chicago.

St. Louis gained a full game and its 1 1/2 back in third place. Fourth-place Brooklyn's 3-0 victory over New York put the Dodgers only three games out.

Fifth-place Philadelphia moved to within four games of first with a triumph over Pittsburgh, 5-4.

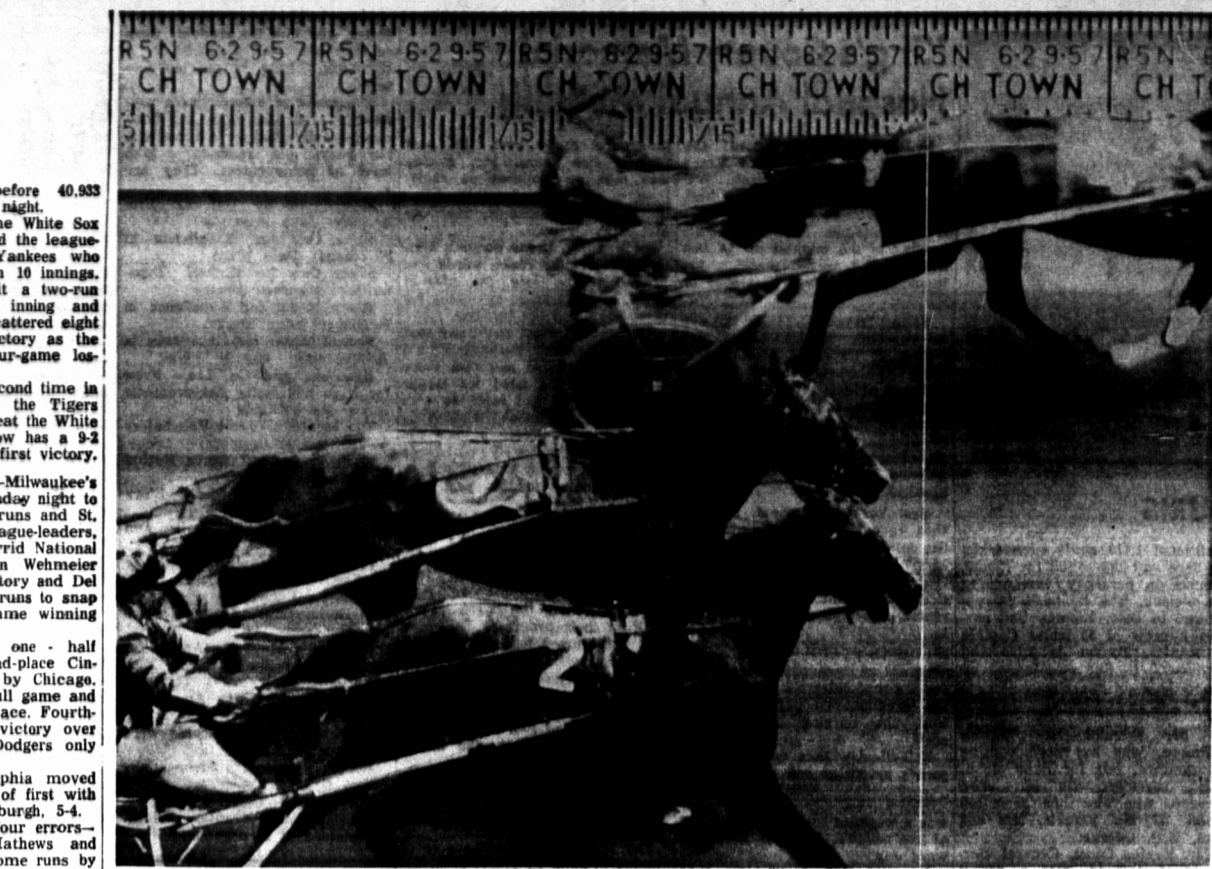
