FIXED LIGHT ON NORTH POINT.

THE Government of Prince Edward Island has given Notice that a light has recently been established on North Point being the Northern extremity of that Island.

The light is a fixed white light, 80 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather at a distance of about 14 miles.

The tower stands in lat 47 deg. 3 min. 46 sec. N., long. 63 deg. 59 min. 9 sec. West of Greenwich.
