

Expect Construction Boom In Maritimes This Spring

HALIFAX (CP)—A \$300,000,000 construction boom will hit the Atlantic provinces in full stride with the coming of warm weather.

National Employment Service expects the labor demand to be so heavy that Newfoundland will likely have to import help and there will be shortages in some trades.

Already \$150,000,000 worth of work is under way and the boom is expected to hit full tempo during June and July.

In Newfoundland alone an additional \$100,000,000 worth of construction is expected to open up. It's headed by United States spending.

More than 15,000 workers are expected to find employment during the peak of construction but the NES monthly review says there is likely to be a shortage of some skilled tradesmen.

A severe winter of sleet, snow and floods delayed some of the preliminary work and will add to the warm weather rush.

Work at the United States' Argentina naval base in Newfoundland is expected to total \$100,000,000 alone. Another \$5,000,000 will be spent on a USAF housing project near St. John's.

At the Maritimes, close to 2,000 men are already working at the army's Camp Gagetown in New Brunswick. A thousand are working on a new oil refinery near Halifax.
