Souris Explosion Victim Succumbs

SOURIS — Following two weeks hospitalization as the result of an accident in Souris, June 11, Maurice Doucette, 31-year-old resident of St. Charles died in the Charlottetown Hospital Tuesday.

Doucette was injured in an early morning explosion at the Eastern Fisheries plant and was taken to hospital in Souris suffering from severe burns and exposure to deadly ammonia gas. He was transferred to the Charlottetown Hospital later the same day.

It could not be learned last night if an inquest would be held.

In addition to his wife Gertrude, Mr. Doucette is survived by a brother, John in Souris;

three sons, Albert 30, St. Charles; Richard, 29, Toronto; and Leonard, 20, St. Charles; and two daughters, Theresa, Mrs. Daniel Johnston, Souris and Priscilla in St. Charles.

The funeral will be held from his late residence in St. Charles Friday morning leaving the home at 9:30 in St. Charles' Church. Interment will be in the church cemetery.

Lobsters Get High Prices At Belfast

Abnormally high prices are being paid for lobsters in some areas with a River John, N.S. buyer offering 45 cents for canners and 51 cents for market lobsters at one landing stage in the Belfast area last week, it was reported today.

Fishermen in Belfast district area union are getting about 56 cents net for their market lobsters, it was learned from Fred VanDerstine of Eldon who says the tasty crustaceans bring 47 cents in Canadian funds on the Boston market. The transportation, holding and other charges run to roughly 11 cents, he said.

Stewart Ross, MLA, a member of the union, said recently that union members averaged about 51 cents a last year for their markets. Members were unable to say how much they would average this year as the present high price did not hold at the start of the season.

George Agnew, Charlottetown told this paper that a Cape Bauld, N. B. buyer had been offering as high as 47 cents for market lobsters last week and at one stage was offering 44 cents per pound straight.

Meanwhile, so far as could be learned today, the regular price across the province was running about 35 cents for canners and 42 for markets.

President of the Canadian Bar Association, Stanley Fennell, QC, attended the ceremony, and was introduced by A. W. Matheson, QC.

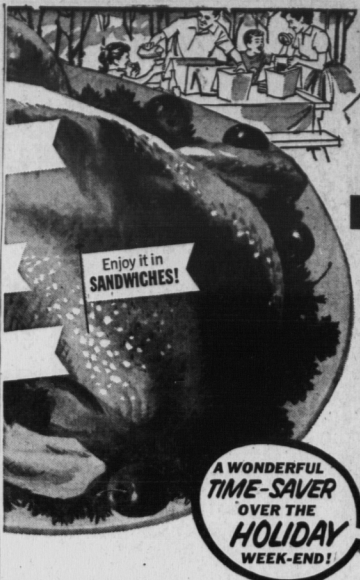
Mr. Matheson also made application on behalf of Roger Vincent, with C. F. Bentley making application for Dr. Lusting.
