CHARLES H. CROSSMAN

There passed peacefully away into the eternal rest at his home in Cape Traverse on September 6th, Charles H. Crossman, in the 75th year of his age, after an illness of six months, which he bore with christian patience and fortitude.

Born at Albany, P.E.I. in 1883, the son of John and Phoebe Crossman, he moved to Cape Traverse when a young boy, where he farmed until three years ago. The home was one where acquaintances were graciously welcomed. Unconsciously he filled a vital place in the church where he gave of his best to its furtherance and welfare.

The funeral services at the home and Church of Scotland, were conducted by his pastor, Rev. J.H. Bishop. The large attendance at these services bore testimony to the regard and esteem in which Mr. Crossman was held. Hymns sung were: "Unto the Hills" and "23rd Psalm". IN MEMORIAM

DAVID L. McINNIS

The tragic and sudden death on Wednesday, September 4th, of David Louis McInnis, due to a regrettable accident, shocked and saddened the people of Kensington as well as a host of friends in Summerside and elsewhere.

Dave as he was familiarly known was born at Summerside on February 21, 1921, a son of Mr and Mrs. John McInnis. As a young man he lived for a time at Burlington, P.E.I., and later served overseas in the Second World War. While in England he met and married Ruby Leggett of Woking, Surrey, England. It was in England that he was the victim of head injuries suffered in collision with a motor car

while riding as an army motorcyclist.

Returning to Canada the couple made their home in Kensington where he was in the employ of George Brookins, a friend where he was considered to be an exceptionally capable workman.

As a goal tender with the Summerside Aces, he was also "one of the best" and did much to encourage hockey in the Kensington area.

He will be sadly missed at work and at play, but the heavy burden falls on his wife in the loss of a kind and devoted husband and the four young children, Ruby, Pearl, Sylvia, and David, Jr., who will always remember his loving care for, and pride in them. Also surviving are his mother Mrs. Elizabeth Heckbert of Montreal, two

sisters, Mrs. Blanche Perry, and Rose, Mrs. Wilfred Heckbert, Summerside, four brothers, Carl, Hillard, Everett, and Joe all in Toronto, and a step-sister, Miss Irene Heckbert. His father passed away many years ago. A brother Jim was killed in the Second World War and another brother, Danny lost his life in an accident while operating a large transport truck.

The funeral was held on Saturday from St. Mark's Church, Kensington, the Rev. G.S.F. Ebsary officiating. With Mrs. Kenneth Pidgeon at the organ, the choir led in the singing of the hymns, "Abide with Me," and "Rock of Ages." The members of the Canadian Legion, Kensington branch, attended in a body, as did also the Summerside Aces Hockey Team.

Palbearers were Brookings employees: Messrs. Gerald A. McCarville, James MacKenzie, Joseph Woodside, Edwin Beirsto, Colin and Elmer Burt. Flower bearers were six ex-service men: Messrs. William Gill, Frank Baglole, S. E. Peppin, Major Sinclair, Ernest Taylor, and Thibault.

The flag draped casket was interred in the People's Cemetery, Kensington, where the Last Post was sounded by Bugler Aubin Gallant of Summerside.

Attending to the esteem in which he was held, the many beautiful floral pieces came from neighborhood friends, all ages, various hockey groups, and many other sources.

WILLIAM JAMES HOWATT

There passed away in Charlottetown on August 12th after a long illness, William James Howatt in the 90th year of his age. Up to a year and a half ago the deceased had been an unusually active man for his years when he was suddenly stricken with a stroke from which he failed to recover and on the above date he unexpectedly passed away in the early morning hours while in his sleep.
