In Canada, there are various organizations that have shown concern for the conditions of Third World refugees. A couple of weeks ago, the World University Service of Canada (WUSC) sponsored a tremendous display of Caravan products at the Robertson Library Pit. Caravan, a Third World handicraft sale, was a priority to help market refugee products. Such a market enables people develop patterns of self-reliance and meet basic needs in their struggle for political and economic self determination.

The efforts of those who contributed towards this worthwhile project should not go unnoticed. It is crystal clear that the response from caring people on the Island is growing. It is resulted in UPEI faculty members and students volunteering in Third World Countries.

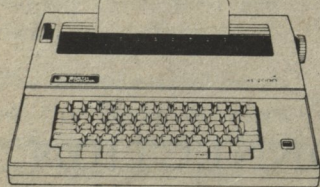
Consider living in one area wrought by civil war or regional conflict.
