The New Parliament

COMPLETE LIST OF THE MEMBERS

Below we publish a complete list of mem-
bers elected to the new Parliament, with
the majorities as compared with 1878, as
far as the returns have been published.
The elections have not yet taken place in
British Columbia and Manitoba, but the
gents themselves frankly admit that both
these provinces will return united delegations
of Liberal Conservatives. We, therefore,
for the purpose of comparison, in the fol-
lowing recapitulation, give the members
from those provinces as Liberal-Conserva-

THE FIFTH VOLUME of the "Canada Short-
horn Herd Book," just issued, is a remark-
able advance upon its predecessors. The
arrangement has been simplified in many
ways. The bulls are all entered alphabeti-
cally and the cows under the names of the
breeders, the latter being alphabetical. An
immense labor has been bestowed upon the
details, with the object of compressing the
information into smaller space and avoid-
ing repetition, at the same time omitting
nothing material, and making this volume
complete in itself. This is the first volume
issued since the new standard was adopted.
All animals to be registered must now trace
in all crosses to imported cows or to cows
already registered having seven crosses or
99.21 per cent of pure blood. This volume
practically, therefore, begins a new Herd
Book, and it is so constructed that purchas-
ers will not need to buy the former volumes.
The whole arrangement reflects the highest
credit upon the skill and patience of Mr.
Wade, Secretary of the Association, from
whom copies of the volume (reduced in price
to \$2 50) can be had.

QUEEN VICTORIA is both to surrender
property which has once come into her
possession. Clarendon, bought by her from
the nation, and now the residence of the
young Duke of Albany, has only been lent
to him. The Queen retains her own suite
of rooms there, which are kept locked up.
It is now stated that General Ignatieff re-
signed the Russian Ministry of the Interior
because he could no longer guarantee the
safety of the Emperor. Credibility is lent
to this view by the fact that since his
resignation the political police have been
revised.
