Well, you're right. For now, that is.

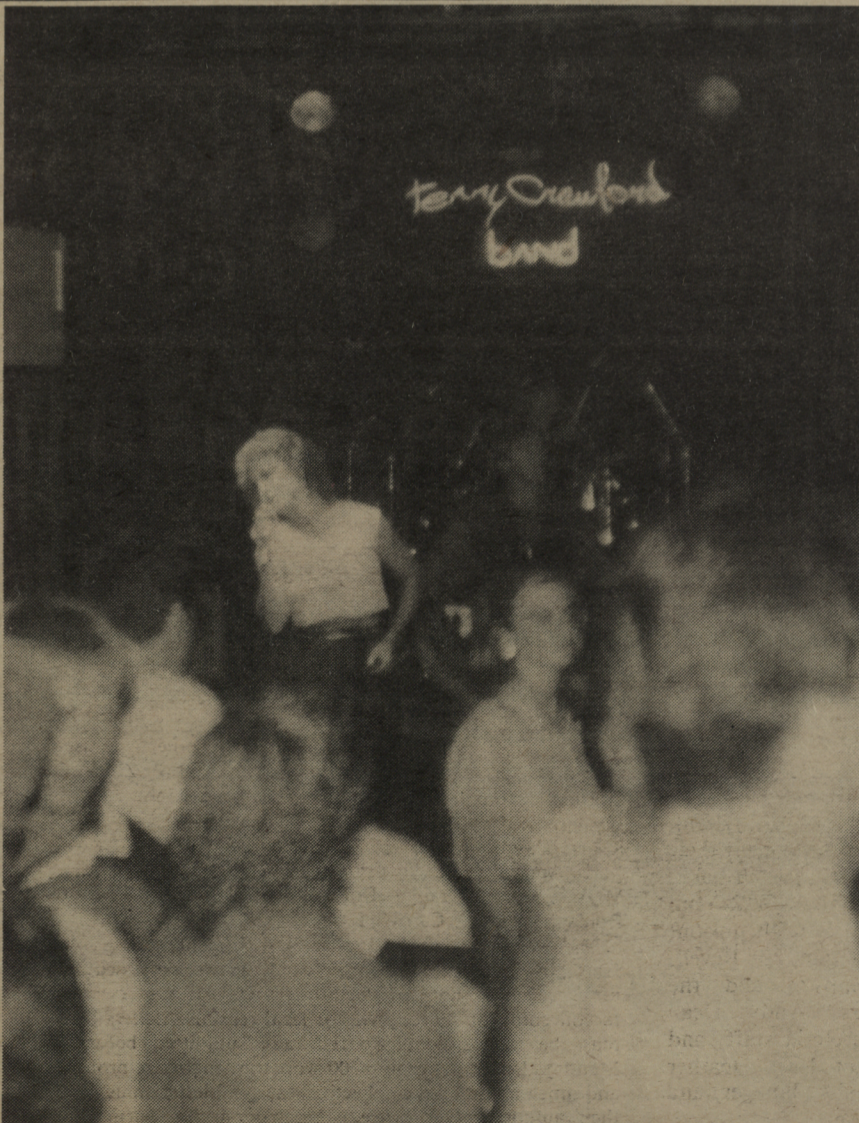
You won't see everything promised appearing all in next week's issue, but we will keep our promises - that's usually more than you can say for our boys in Ottawa,
