FREDERICTON (CP) — Fredrickton Capitals averted elimination from the Maritime Senior "B" hockey semi-final Monday night by upsetting Parkdale Flyers 8-2, leaving Parkdale with a 2-1 lead in games.

TORONTO (CP)—Nothing is official, but rumor in Toronto Sunday night was that there'll be some changes made in the Maple Leaf hockey organization before next season rolls around.

Following president Conn Smythe's Sunday press conference in New York, Toronto's evening newspapers—the Telegram and the Star—gave their readers plenty to chew on. They agreed that general manager Hap Day and coach Howie Meeker were on their way out.

At no time during the tape-recorded conference did Smythe say he was not satisfied with Meeker or Day. The colorful boss of the Leafs took sole responsibility for what he termed "a year of failure" by his fifth-place National League club and said "the president's job is as vulnerable as any other."

That sparked the speculation. Sports editor Milt Dunnell of the Star said the fate of Day and Meeker would depend on what Smythe advised the board of directors to do.
