

Civil Defence Air Raid Sirens Tested At Ottawa

OTTAWA, May 16 — (CP) — Two days of sudden eerie siren wailing in this capital ended yesterday as civil defence planners completed tests of equipment which might be used to warn Canada against air attack.

Officials expressed satisfaction with both pieces of equipment tested, a two-horsepower American-type commercial siren and a five-horsepower dual-note British-type machine. Both may be adopted.

A final decision has not yet been made.

The wailing, high-pitched and lonely sounds sent housewives scurrying to telephones, fearful that enemy bombers were over the capital.

Local newspapers were besieged by calls. So were police and fire departments. Pedestrians in the streets craned their necks, searching the skies for the unseen intruders.

At one point Monday, traffic in a downtown street was temporarily halted, as motorists pulled up to listen to the eerie air raid signal wail.

Even a bald eagle, with a wing spread which some residents estimated at six feet, got into the show.

As the sirens sounded, the eagle could be seen, wheeling and soaring over the city.

The sirens were mounted on the roof of the downtown headquarters of the Civil Service Commission—the Hunter building. Spotlights in various parts of the city reported sound range.

Civil defence officials said the best of the spotters were the voluntary ones—the alarmed housewives and others who rushed to telephones to report the wailing sounds to newspapers. By checking the areas in which these persons were located, officials could tell how well the sirens could be heard.

Officials said while they liked both types of sirens, they were anxious to get an unusual sound, so that Canadians could distinguish it easily and realize quickly what it signified.

Sirens are going to be provided by the government to every Canadian community with a population of more than 20,000.
