WINNIPEG, Sept. 13 (CP)—Coarse grain prices took on an easier tone in dull trading today on Winnipeg Grain Exchange. Flax was the only commodity to register advances. Weakness in United States markets prompted the declines. Hedging sales were moderate but lack of aggressive demand and substantial support aided in the declines. Shippers made early purchases of oats and barley futures. Rye came in for American demand early in the session but local selling outweighed the buying. Flax advanced on light offerings and some small trades. Class two wheat, for export to countries outside the international wheat agreement, was unchanged. In export business Chile was reported as taking 70,000 bushels of Canadian wheat. Closing quotes: Oats: Oct. 92 1-2; Dec 83 3-4; May 84 1-4. Barley: Oct. 1.32 1-4; Dec 1.21 1-2 5-8; May 1.21 7-8 5-8.
