



### FIND MUSKRAT ON S'IDE STREET

An encounter with a live muskrat at the corner of Milton Avenue and Granville Street in Summerside about 11:30 Wednesday night, was the unusual experience shared by Winsor Campbell (left) and Victor Ramsay (right) of Summerside.

While many current fish stories describe the "one" that got away,

the two men have the proof (above) of their encounter.

While proceeding on to Milton Avenue from Granville Street the men observed the muskrat crossing the street, and stopped their car for a closer inspection of the animal, which, at that point, was a full seven blocks distance from the nearest harbor waters.

The muskrat began running along the curb on Granville Street, heading towards the harbor, as the men approached him on foot.

When they were about four feet from the animal it turned and prepared to attack Mr. Ramsay, who jumped into the air, landing in the fortunate position that his feet came down on top of the

muskrat killing the animal on the spot, and thus escaping the sharp teeth that could have done serious injury had they been successful in the attack.

### Prince Welfare League Annual Meeting Is Held

At the annual meeting of the Prince County Welfare League held last night in the meeting room of the Civic Auditorium, the Hon. Paul Martin, Auditor, the Hon. Robert MacNeil, Minister of Finance, and other dignitaries were present.

The financial report was submitted by Mr. T. Earle Hickey C.A., and in commenting on the report Mr. Hickey pointed out that there had been an operating deficit of \$633.08 but it was felt that without any public appeal for funds having been made during the year that the voluntary contributions had been very generous and that these had made possible the good work performed by the agency in its first period of operations.

Mr. Hickey said that a financial drive will be launched in Summerside in June with an objective of \$3,000 and the remaining \$5,200 which had been budgeted for would be allocated to the respective parishes in Prince County.

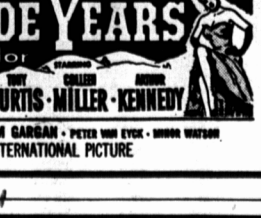
