Dr. Douglas A. C. MacDonald, who graduated from the Dalhousie Medical School on May 15th this year, has left for Glace Bay where he will be associated with the Glace Bay Clinic. Dr. MacDonald was born in Charlottetown twenty-two years ago and received his early education at the Model School and Queen Square and then attended Prince of Wales College, graduating from there with an Honour Diploma in 1946. He immediately entered Dalhousie University and after successfully completing his course, received the degree of M.D.C.M. at the Convocation exercises this year. While at Prince of Wales Dr. MacDonald was keenly interested in sport and was a valued member of both the basketball and rugby squads. He kept up his interest while at Dalhousie and played with the University English rugby team for several years. During the summers Dr. MacDonald was a member of R. C. A. M. C. Officer's Training Corps and qualified for the rank of Captain in that corps. He interned at various hospitals, including the Barriclet Military Hospital, Halifax Infirmary, St. John General, Victoria General, Halifax, and the Prince Edward Island Hospital, Charlottetown.
