Telephone Service Is Opened To Lennox Island

Thirteen-year-old Hazel Peters on Monday, May 25, about 8.00 p.m. became the first resident of Lennox Island to make telephone conversation from Lennox Island to a point on Prince Edward Island. This was made possible by a two-core submarine cable some 2,800 feet in length across the Malpique Bay, between the two islands.

The submarine cable was laid under the direction of Mr. E. G. Cameron, superintendent of the Island Telephone Company, who in a test call to his wife in Charlottetown, was actually the first person to speak over the new line. Miss Peters, a resident of the island, in a conversation immediately after the one by Mr. Cameron, became the first resident of the island to enjoy the advantages of the telephone.

Let's Talk It Over

If you want to measure the true worth of a democratic nation or government, find out about the condition of its minority groups. If they are faring well and their rights are being protected, the bodies governing them have a quality far more indicative of true statesmanship than political acumen. The pressure groups, those who wield the big stick, naturally get their wants fulfilled, because in a democratic state, the existence of the government depends on the loyalty of these. But the smaller groups, whose voting power is not sufficient to make an appreciable change in the results on election day, are at the mercy of what amounts to, as far as they are concerned, a "pressure group dictatorship" and their prosperity and well-being will be in direct proportion to the integrity of those who govern them.

Let's Talk It Over

They cannot pressure governments into compliance with their wishes in regard to lifting the educational standard to the desired height. They can only appeal to the largesse of the government on the basis of a very real need. Therefore, educational standards in a country or province is a pretty good barometer of government worth. Education's position in the economic picture is unique due to the fact that the lower the standard of education in an area, the less disposed the people will be to effect a change. As education increases, the need for it becomes more apparent. Because of this, if a government is to raise educational standards in a sub standard area it must risk its political life to a certain extent by bringing about educational improvement not approved of by a fairly large percentage of the people.

Coronation Sports At Kensington

The Coronation committee have decided to make it a never-to-be-forgotten day for the children and adolescents, by putting on a big program of athletic sports. Kensington will comprise 28 nearby school districts. There will be souvenirs for all competitors from six years up. The sports will take place on the athletic field after Her Majesty's broadcast to the world (approximately 4.30) and will continue until all have had their athletic ability tried. It will be a big program, and it is hoped that parents and guardians will assist in getting children "on their marks" promptly, in order to avoid unnecessary delays.
