Receipts on Montreal livestock

markets today were 99 cattle, 208

sheep and lambs, 744 hogs and

1,074 calves.

Cattle were steady, calves and

the few cattle offered were

mostly cows and bulls. Good cows

made \$5.50 with medium kinds

down to \$3.50. Canners and cut-

ters were \$2.50 to \$3.25. Common

hogs were mostly \$4 to \$4.50.

Calves were in good demand

and prices firm. Good veal made

\$7 to \$7.50 with medium kinds

from \$6 to \$6.50 and common

light veals down to \$5.75. Bulk

of the week were sold between \$5-

25 and \$5.75. Drinkers and light

grassers were mostly \$4.50.

Lambs were easier. The bulk of

the lambs were sold on a flat basis

at \$10.50 to \$11, with one small

lot of good lambs at \$11.50. Sheep

were from \$2.50 to \$3.50.

Hogs were sold on \$9.50 for bacon

fed and watered. Selects drew

\$1 premium with the regular cuts

on off grades. Feeders hogs were

slow and about 300 freshly dressed

from Flanders' markets. Sows

were \$5.25 to \$5.75. Hogs sold on

rail grade brought \$13 for bacon

cut weight.

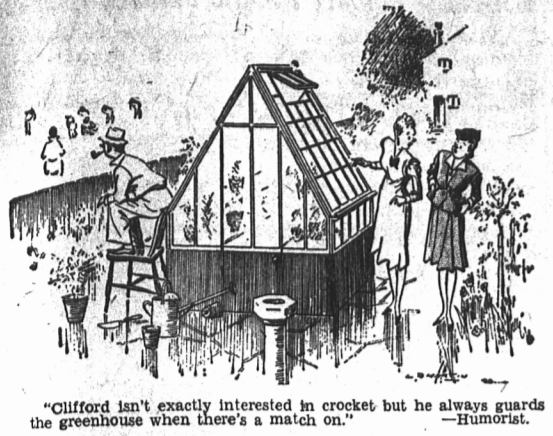
