The History Society recently held the draw for the complete set of Island Magazines. Congratulations to Brenda Beaton for winning this valuable prize.

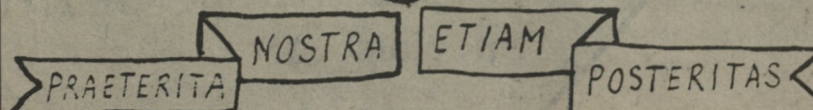
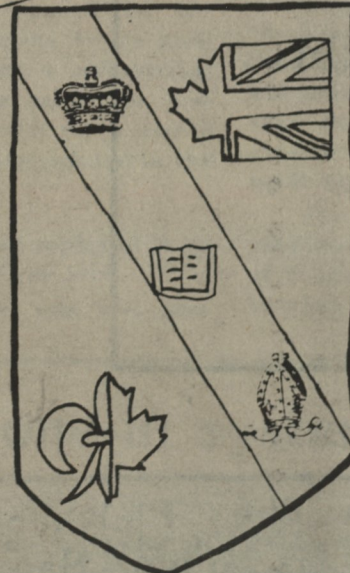
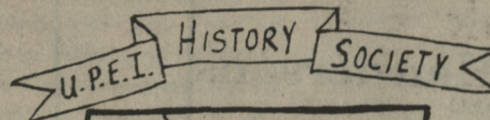
A belated thanks is extended to Dean MacMillan for hosting a History Society party last February 6th. All truly enjoyed themselves and we look forward to future such gatherings.

Linda Gordon who won the 50-50 Draw which was held at Dean's party. We trust that you didn't spend it all at once, eh Linda?

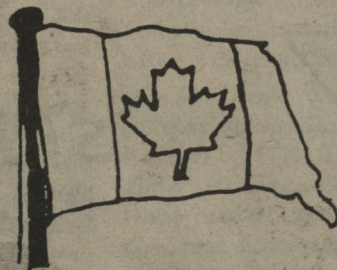
In closing we remind all members that meeting times are Thursdays from 11:00-12:00pm in RL Conference room B.
